#### **METHODOLOGY AND SUMMARY**



Assessment conducted in affected areas





Assessment conducted through phone interviews with key informants

The purpose of emergency tracking tool is to collect information on large and sudden population movements, as well as on security and climatic emergencies. On 11 August 2021, 1,032 Chadian nationals (133 households) arrived in the locality of Kaliwa (9th district of N'Djamena, Chad), following an inter-communal conflict that happened at the beginning of August 2021 and affected the localities of Bekoro, Kawadji and Djaramboukou (Far North region, Cameroon). These persons are hosted in two primary schools and a college. They are made up largely of children (73%), the majority of adults having remained in the places of provenance. They indicated that they had lived in Cameroon for many years and were considering returning to their places of provenance in this country as soon as the security situation improved.

## SUMMARY ANALYSIS BY SECTOR



The 1,032 Chadian nationals (133 households) settled in the classrooms of the primary schools of Kaliwa, Abnaback and the College of General Education (CEG) of Naman. However, some sleep in the open as there are insufficient classrooms to host them. It should be noted that in addition to these people, a significant number of Cameroonian nationals are also settled in the same host locations.



An existing bakery in the host area has provided breads to those affected, as the food shortage is important. Some persons said they have begun working in host populations' rice farms in order to have financial means to buy food.

In the three host areas, the affected people use water from existing pumps. The existing latrines in these places have become unusable due to the high number of people using them. As a result, more and more people are forced to wash and defecate in the open.






