The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. This dashboard provides information on displacement which occurred on 05 March 2022, in the province of Lac.

SUMMARY OF EVENT



DISPLACED POPULATION:

200 Internally Displaced Persons, **50** Households (estimation)

Following an attack which occurred on 17 February 2022 in the village of Kimé (sous-prefecture of Ngouboua) by non-state armed groups, 50 households of 200 individuals displaced for the first time, left the villages of Kimé and Kairom situated in the sous-prefecture of Ngouboua (department of Kaya) and transited through multiple locations before arriving on 5 March 2022 in the newly established Boudoutouba site (in the sous-prefecture of Bagasola, department of Kaya).

REASON FOR MOVEMENT: Armed attack


MEANS OF TRANSPORT: On foot and riding animals
