SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

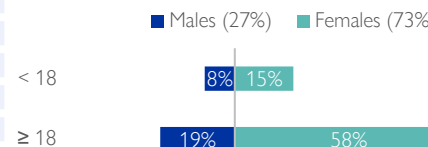
The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as security and climactic emergencies. Information is collected through phone interviews with key informants and direct observation.

Following a fire of unknown origin, that occurred on **04 March 2023** in the site of Medi koura, situated in Bol sous-prefecture, department of Mamdi, **110 households (470 individuals)** were affected. This incident caused considerable damage to shelters, resulting in the loss of non-food items, livestock and agricultural stocks.

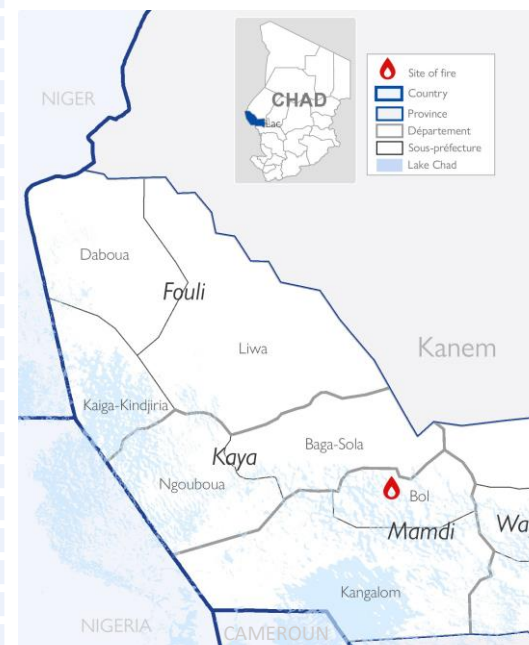

OBSERVATIONS AND ANALYSIS



Households that lost their shelters to fire lost most of their non-food items. They reported urgent needs for non-food items **including mosquito nets, blankets, mats, cooking utensils, water storage containers and clothing.**



Agricultural stocks, which were the main livelihoods of individuals, were completely damaged. Livestock losses were also reported (two donkeys were lost). In addition, these individuals have not received any food assistance apart from that provided by the non-affected individuals in the site, but this remains insufficient to cover their food needs.



The fire completely destroyed **65 houses** and partially damaged **45 houses**. In of this critical situation, 65 households are currently staying with host families.



Vulnerable groups reported include **07 female heads of household, 13 pregnant women, 06 lactating women and 09 persons older than 60 years.**
