









## Figure 3. IDPs' age and sex disaggregation




# Figure 4. Age and sex disaggregation of IDPs residing in sites




#### Figure 6. IDPs by municipality section (admin 2)



## Figure 7. Proportion of IDPs in host families and sites per host region








#### Figure 10. IDPs by department of provenance (admin 1)





Figure 15. Displacement year by main municipalities of origin



As such, it does not present the overall evolution or the cumulative number of displacements for a given year, but rather reflects the periods marking the <u>beginning of</u> displacement of persons currently displaced.




