The assessment of people affected by the earthquake is conducted at the household level in Herat, with an objective to identify their needs, and a specific focus on IDPs. As of 25th November, this assessment has included 5% IDPs and 95% non-IDPs impacted by the earthquakes. A comprehensive joint needs assessment is conducted by representatives from various humanitarian clusters and partner agencies, targeting the particular needs of the affected communities. Data is systematically collected and recorded through a harmonized Kobo form. Needs of IDPs were found to be similar to the needs of other populations.

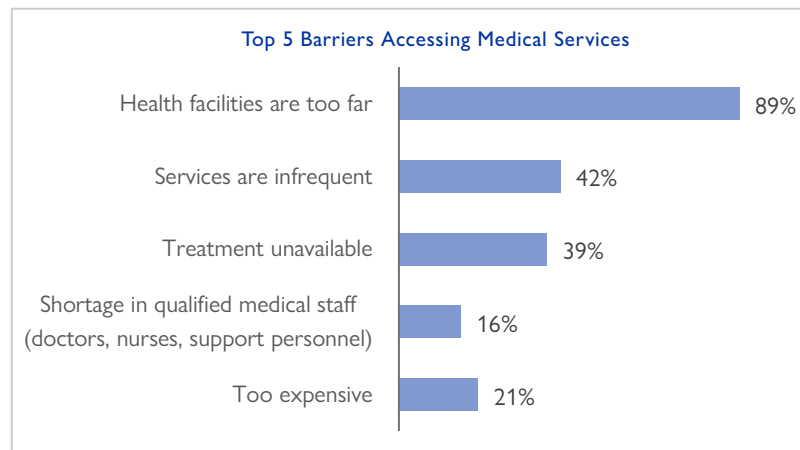
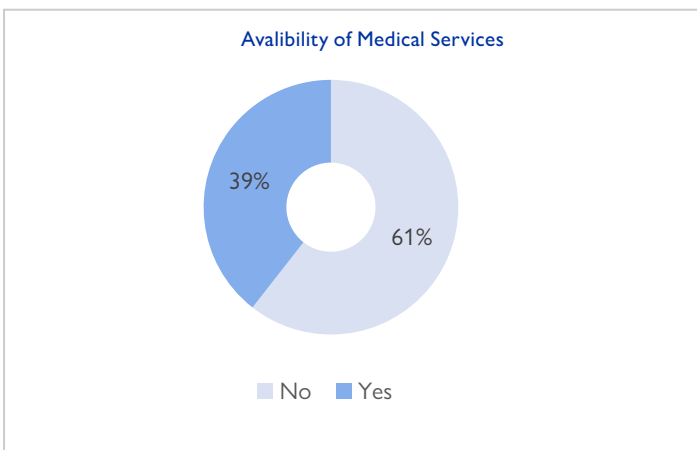

### Reported functionality of schools that children attended prior to earthquake

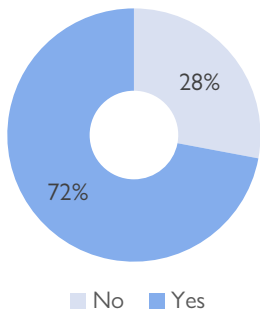


### School Condition After Earthquake

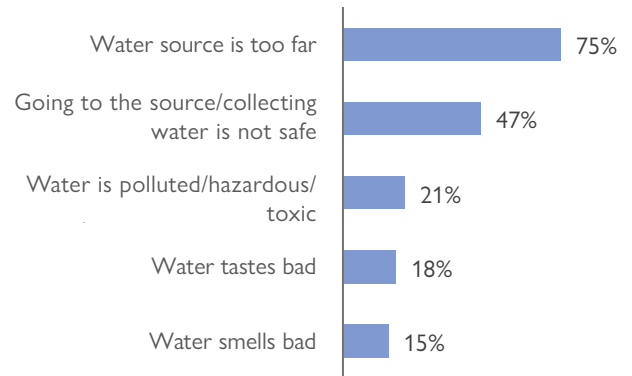

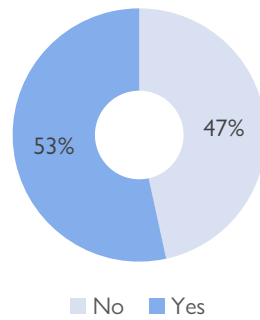

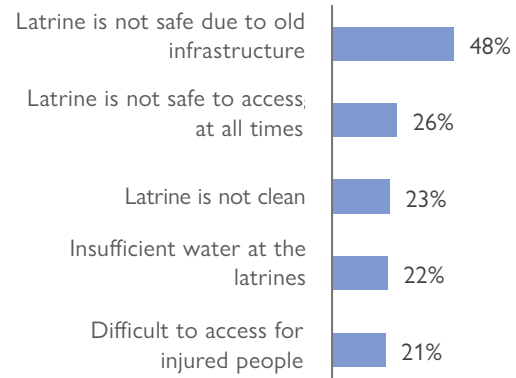
### Barriers Accessing Enough Water for Drinking, Cooking, Bathing and Washing, Top 5



### Access to Functional Latrines

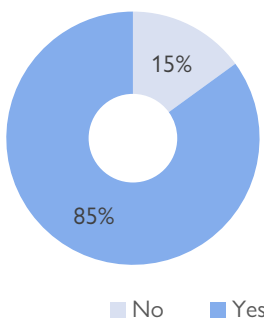

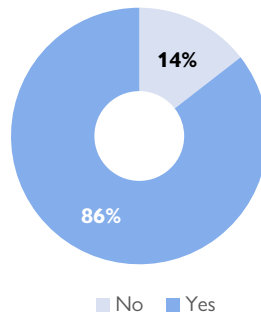
