OVERVIEW

The Registered IDP Area Baseline Assessment provides granular data on the number and geographic location of officially registered internally displaced people (IDPs). This report assesses registered IDP presence at the hromada level, also mapping the recorded change since the previous round. Round 26 presents the data of the registered IDP population disaggregated by sex, age and state-recognized disability status.¹

The data collected for the Area Baseline Assessment Round 26 reflects the up-to-date local administrative register of the IDP population as of 31 July 2023, equivalent to a total of 3,677,601 registered IDPs. Registered IDP figures were collected for 1,039 hromadas (78% of all hromadas covered in the Ukrainian government-controlled areas). Data disaggregated by age, sex and disability status were provided for around 76 per cent of the administrative units covered.


For this assessment, IOM define IDPs as persons who officially registered as fleeing their habitual place of residence due to the current war in Ukraine


The data in this report was sourced locally from oblast authorities and their official IDP registration data per oblast, raion, and hromada, where available. As such, it likely represents an undercount of those who have been de facto forced to flee their homes.

KEY INSIGHTS

- Among oblasts, Kharkivska (510,775), Dnipropetrovska (388,845) and Kyivska (334,148) have the highest number of officially registered IDPs.
- At the raion level, Kharkivskyi (286,574), Kyivska (264,490), and Dniprovskyi (166,874) host the highest number of registered IDPs.
- Donetska and Kirovohradska Oblasts have the highest share of registered IDPs aged 60 and over (41% and 31% respectively).
- Across the country, around 5% of registered IDPs have a state-recognized disability status.



CHANGES IN REGISTERED IDP FIGURES

Changes in the caseload of registered IDPs are measured controlling for variations in the area covered compared to the previous round. The map above shows the changes in hromadas that were assessed in both Rounds 25 and 26.

Consistent with previous trends, the number of registered IDPs in the eastern and southern oblasts continues to grow. The most significant increases were observed in Kharkivska (+10,600 IDPs from R25), Zaporizka (+5,700), Kyiv city (+5,600), Donetsk (+3,700), Odeska (+2,700), Dnipropetrovska, and Mykolaivska (+2,200 each), and Sumska (+2,000) Oblasts. Particularly in the southern oblasts, displacement dynamics are still partly influenced by the aftermath of the Nova Kakhovka dam collapse on June 6th. KIs indicated that in Khersonska Oblast, most IDPs have relocated from de-occupied areas to the city of Kherson, while the rest are scattered among the northern hromadas, which remain unaffected by the flooding caused by the Kakhovka dam collapse.

Additionally, since Round 25, an increase in registered IDPs in Dnipropetrovska Oblast was observed. This can be attributed to displacement from areas heavily affected by shelling as well as the scarcity of drinking water caused by the

initial floods and subsequent drought resulting from the destruction of the dam. Similarly, Kryyyi Rih has experienced a comparable trend, as reported by KIs, with the limited or non-existent availability of water from the central supply network contributing to population outflows, potentially to other displacement areas.

Intra-oblast displacement was prevalent in Mykolaivska, Sumska, and Donetsk Oblasts. Mykolaiv city saw a significant increase in registered IDPs, driven by employment opportunities. Sumska Oblast continued to experience a trend of increasing internal displacement, with residents leaving more dangerous border areas for safer zones. In Donetsk Oblast, there was a remarkable increase in registered IDPs from the same oblast and neighboring ones like Kharkivska and Luhansk, fleeing ongoing active conflict zones for safer areas. Conversely, the western oblasts show a downward trend in the number of registered IDPs. According to KIs, this decrease is partly due to migratory movements back to their respective areas of origin, subject to security factors allowing such return, as well as de-registration resulting from displacement abroad.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Central and western oblasts have a higher proportion of registered younger IDPs. For example, in Ivano-Frankivska (43%), Zakarpatska (36%), Chernivetska, and Zhytomyrska (35% each), Lvivska (32%), and Vinnytska (31%) Oblasts, the share of children among registered IDPs is above the national average. In contrast, Kharkivska (41%) and Kirovohradskaya (29%) Oblasts observe a relatively high proportion of registered IDPs aged 60 and over.

Moreover, the proportion of female IDPs in all western oblasts is significantly higher than the rest of the country, with Ivano-Frankivska (67%) and Zakarpatska (65%) Oblasts having the highest share. Conversely, in southern and eastern oblasts, the proportion of male IDPs is higher than in the rest of the country, peaking in Khersonska (47%) and Zaporizka (44%) Oblasts. Overall, these trends seem to indicate that displaced women and children tend to register as IDPs further away from the areas affected by the war, while the displaced male and older population tends to remain closer to their habitual place of residence.

METHODOLOGY


Data for the Area Baseline Assessment is collected through a network of Key Informants within the local oblast administration bodies across the country. Every month, IOM records figures on registered displacement directly from the regional authorities, as well as sex, age and disability disaggregated estimates among the registered IDP population. In addition, IOM collects feedback from local authorities to explain changes across round and to provide interpretation for the trends observed.

In line with the established Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) approach, IOM endeavors to regularly collect data on the registered IDP population in all territories under the control of the Government of Ukraine. While data collection capacity grows, geographical coverage can change across rounds.

The figures provided in this report reflect the recorded registered IDP population, and as such do not include displaced individuals who have not officially registered with the local authorities. AGE DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTERED IDPs


Figure 1: Age distribution among registered IDPs, by oblast.*

■ Male ■ Female


