

IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT & HOST COMMUNITIES COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 3 (26 Jun - 2 Jul 2022)

As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 220 adult male migrants in community settings in Abusliem and Ain Zara municipalities.

Additionally, 216 (214 migrants and 2 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in community setting in two municipalities during the reporting period (26 Jun - 2 Jul 2022).

Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants and host communities

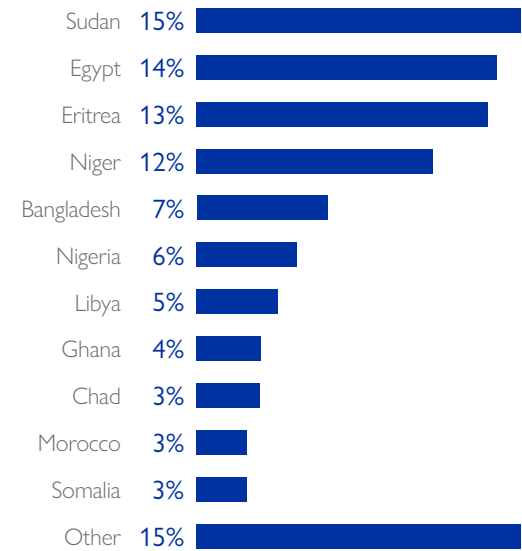


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



By 2 July 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Sudan (15%), Egypt (14%) and Eritrea (14%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated

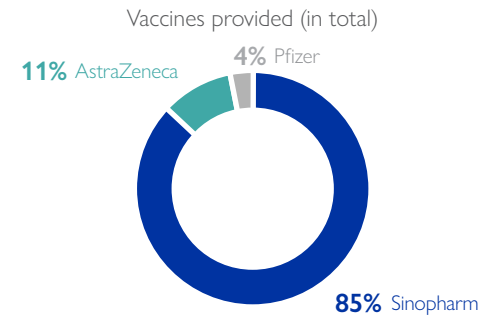

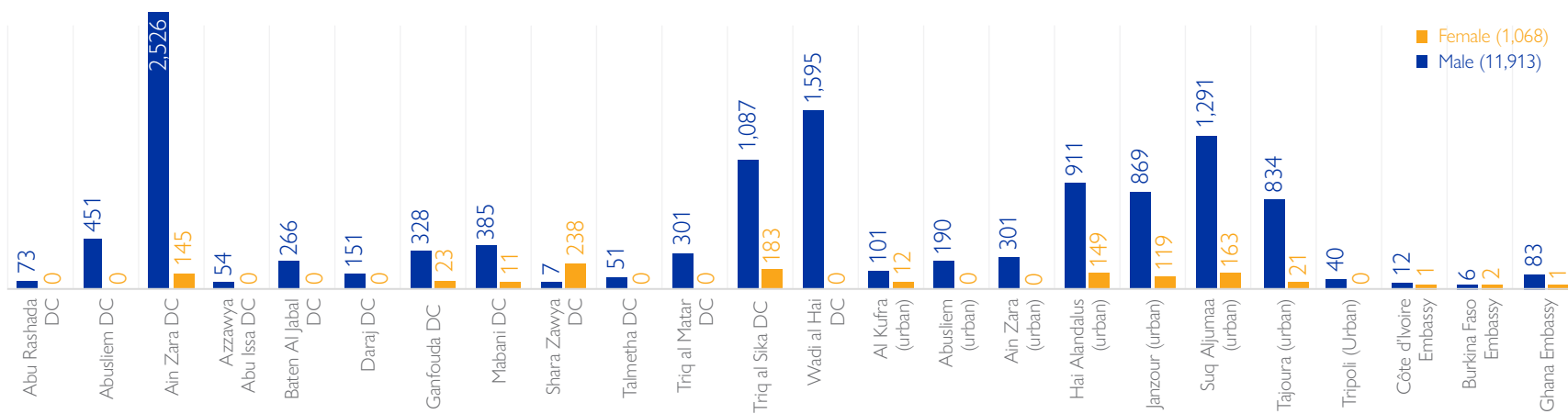

By 2 July 2022, a total of 12,981 persons (1,068 females and 11,913 males) including 12,372 migrants and 609 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,304 people (25%) have received two doses and 641 (5%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
