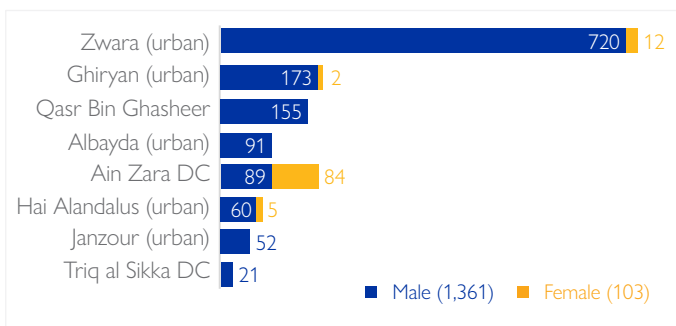


As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM and NCDC conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 2,543 adult migrants (2,356 males and 182 females) in urban settings in five municipalities.

Additionally, 1,464 (1,446 migrants and 18 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in two detention centres, and urban settings in six municipalities during the reporting period (4 - 10 Sep 2022).

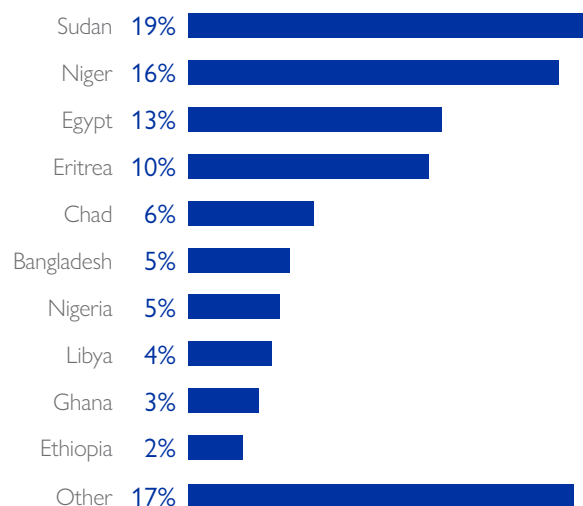
Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants & host community by location



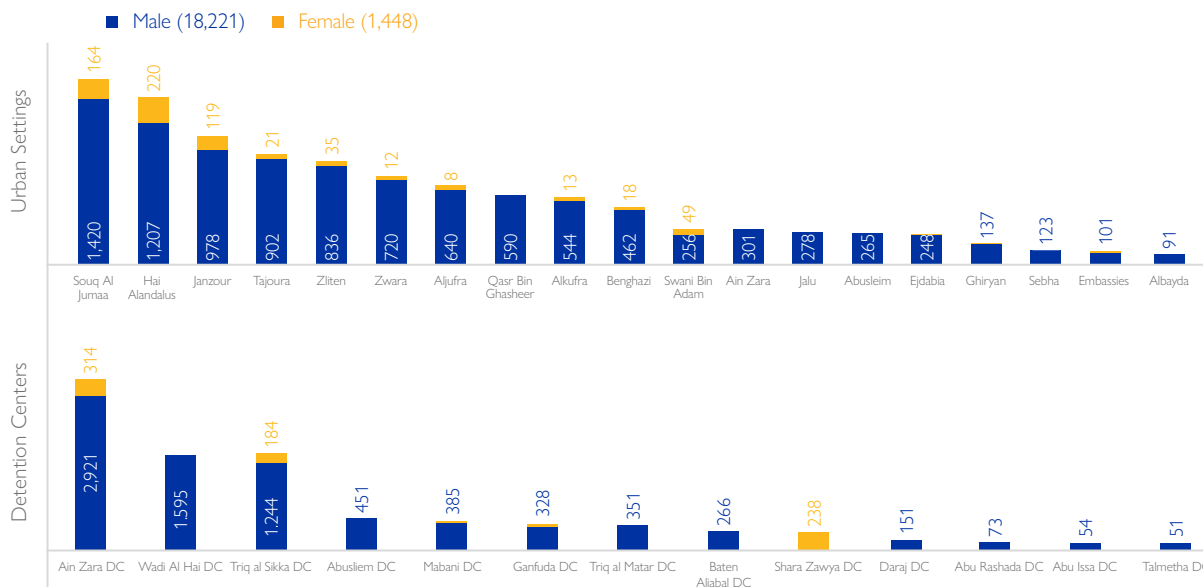

By 10 September 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 40 different countries of origin, including Sudan (19%), Niger (16%) and Egypt (13%).

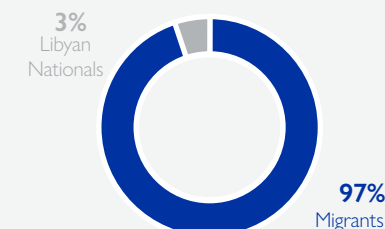
Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated



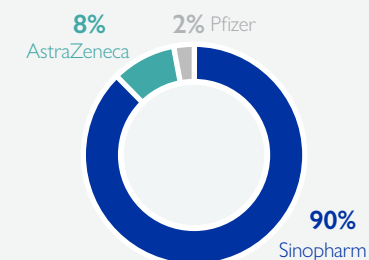
By 10 September 2022, a total of 19,670 persons (1,448 females and 18,221 males) including 18,985 migrants and 685 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,754 people (19%) have received two doses and 848 (4%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
