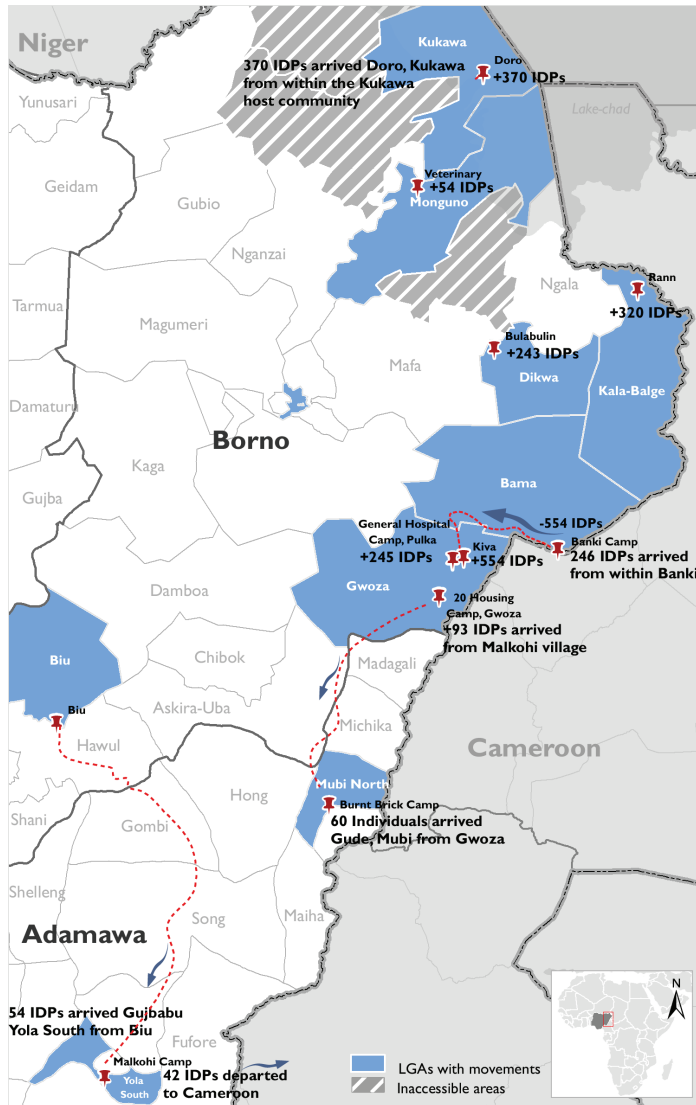


DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX - Nigeria
