



Summary

Askira/Uba (Triggers: voluntary relocation, attacks): 94 new arrivals and 39 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 47 individuals (INDS) who arrived at the town from nearby Huyim Community, 13 INDs who arrived from Mbalala ward of Chibok LGA, 14 INDs who arrived from Taraba State, 13 INDs who arrived from Adamawa State, 7 INDs who arrived from Bauchi State, 25 INDs who left for Gombe State.

Bama (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 53 INDs arrived at Bama town and 65 INDs left Bama during the reporting period. These include 45 arrivals at Banki Camp, 8 arrivals at General Hospital Camp Bama, 33 departures from Banki Camp and 32 departures from General Hospital Camp, Bama.

Chibok (Triggers: voluntary relocation, improved security): 8 INDs arrived at Bayan Kasuwa community from Askira/Uba LGA and 16 INDs left Yobe community in Chibok for Kwamdi ward of Damboa LGA (3 INDs) and Hong LGA in Adamawa (13 INDs).

Damboa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 8 INDs arrived at Damboa Central from Maiduguri M.C. LGA.

Dikwa (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 151 INDs arrived at Dikwa during the reporting period. These include 145 INDs who arrived at 20-Housing Estate and 6 INDs who arrived at Shehuri Camp.

Gubio (Trigger: poor living conditions): 7 INDs arrived at Bula Karaye village from neighbouring Fannari and Dunga villages due to attacks in the villages.

**Gwoza (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions):** 359 INDs arrived at Gwoza and 124 INDs left Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 50 new arrivals at Wege Arrival Centre in Pulka, 125 arrivals at Wakane community, 163 arrivals at Gadamayo community, 18 arrivals at Central Primary School Camp, 3 arrivals at Bulabulin community and 124 departures for Jere LGA from Wakane community.

Jere (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 11 INDs arrived at Farm Centre Camp from Bama and 20 INDs left Muna Garage Camp for International School Camp Ngala.

Kaga (Trigger: poor living conditions): 18 INDs arrived at NRC Camp in Benisheikh from Mainok village in Kaga.

Konduga (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 2 INDs arrived at Boarding School Camp from Siraja in Bama.

Kukawa (Trigger: improved security): 47 INDs arrived at Kukawa town during the reporting period. These include 21 INDs (returnees) who arrived from Maiduguri M.C., 15 INDs who arrived form Jere and 11 INDs who arrived from Cross Kauwa village in Kukawa.

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 39 INDs left Bakasi Camp for Wakane community in Gwoza.

Madagali (Trigger: poor living conditions): 167 INDs arrived at Madagali and 53 INDs left Madagali town during the reporting period. These include 104 INDs who arrived at the town from surrounding villages, 16 INDs who arrived at the town from Ganye LGA, 47 INDs who arrived from Askira/Uba (24 INDs) and Damboa (23 INDs) LGAs in Borno and 53 INDs who left for Gadamayo community in Gwoza.

Mafa (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 29 INDs arrived at Government Girls Secondary School (GGSS) Camp Mafa. These include 20 INDs who arrived from surrounding villages, 5 INDs who arrived from Konduga LGA and 4 INDs who arrived from Jere LGA.

Michika (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 48 INDs arrived at Michika during the reporting period. These include 31 INDs who arrived from surrounding LGAs, 10 INDs who arrived from Kano State and 7 INDs who arrived from Plateau State.

Monguno (Triggers: Voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 45 INDs arrived at Monguno during the reporting period. These include 22 arrivals at Stadium Camp, 15 arrivals at GGSS Camp and 8 arrivals at Water Board Camp.

Mubi-South (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 4 INDs arrived at Anguwan Kara community in from Maiha LGA and 5 INDs left Mubi Burnt Bricks Camp for Arahan-Kunu village in Larmode ward of Mubi-South.

Ngala (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 98 INDs arrived at International School Camp, Ngala during the reporting period. These include 46 INDs who arrived from Fuye ward of Ngala, 25 INDs who arrived from Jere LGA, 21 INDs who arrived from Lagos State and 6 INDs who arrived from Maiduguri M.C.
