

## Summary

Askira/Uba (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 63 new arrivals and 67 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 31 individuals (INDs) who arrived from surrounding wards in Askira/Uba, 27 INDs who arrived from Bego Yerwa ward of Damboa LGA, 5 INDs who returned from Ngomari Coustine in Jere LGA and 67 INDs who left Lassa/Chull ward for Kopa/Multhafu ward due to poor living conditions.

77,326 Bama (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operations): 217 INDs arrived at Bama and 6 INDs left
 67,351 Bama during the reporting period. These include 117 arrivals at General Hospital Camp, 100 arrivals at
 5,024 Banki Camp and 6 departures from General Hospital Camp.

 Damboa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 8 INDs left General Hospital Camp in Damboa to return to
 19,645

Dikwa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 13 INDs arrived at Dikwa Central during the reporting period.
 These include 10 INDs who arrived from Dikwa LGA and 3 INDs who arrived from Muliya ward of Dikwa.

**Gubio (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions):** 12 INDs arrived at Gubio town from surrounding villages due to an attack and 5 INDs left Gubio for Limanti in Damasak LGA.

26,413 Jere (Trigger: attack): 29 INDs left Muna Moforo in Dusuman ward of Jere for Mashsmari ward due to 10,916 recent attacks in the area.

 Kaga (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 42 INDs arrived at NRC Camp in Kaga and 14 INDs left Shuwari community for Damaturu LGA in Yobe.

10,398 Kala/Balge (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 29 INDs arrived at Rann in Kala/Balge during the reporting period. These include 17 INDs who arrived from Jarawa ward of Kala/Bale and 12 INDs who arrived from Gomboru Ngala.

Konduga (Trigger: attack): 319 INDs arrived at Konduga during the reporting period. These include 65 INDs who arrived at Boarding Primary School Camp from Bama due to recent attacks and 254 INDs who arrived at Auno ward from Ganyeri in Magumeri LGA due to recent attacks in Ganyeri village.

Madagali (Triggers: Fear of attack, voluntary relocation, improved security, water scarcity): 87 INDs arrived at Madagali town and 53 INDs left Madagali during the reporting period. These include 35 INDs who arrived at the town from Wonu ward due to fears of attacks, 25 INDs who arrived from Hyambulla ward due to lack of water, 17 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 10 INDs who arrived from Jos South in Plateau State, 15 INDs who left Gulak ward for Gwoza LGA and 38 INDs who left Pallam ward for Gulak ward.

Mafa (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 123 INDs arrived at Mafa during the reporting period. These include 112 arrivals at Mafa Camp B, 7 arrivals at Tukaleri village and 4 arrivals at Hausari village in Mafa.

Magumeri (Trigger: attack): 230 INDs arrived at Gajigana from surrounding villages due to recent attacks in the area.

Maiduguri M.C. (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 2 INDs arrived at Maisandari ward of Maiduguri from Gwoza.

Michika (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 32 INDs arrived at Michika and 6 INDs left Michika during the reporting period. These include 15 INDs who arrived from Makwale in Cameroon, 7 INDs who arrived from Song LGA, 4 INDs who arrived from Billiri in Gombe, 3 arrivals from Lagos and Bauchi States respectively and 6 INDs who left Michika for Yola North in Adamawa State.

Mobbar (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 51 INDs arrived at Monguno and 6 INDs left Monguno during the reporting period. These include 92 INDs who returned from Difa in Niger Republic, 7 INDs who arrived from Maiduguri and 4 INDs who arrived at the town from Damasak ward.

Monguno (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 51 INDs arrived and 6 INDs left Monguno during the reporting period. These include 34 arrivals at Water Board Camp from Nganzai LGA, 17 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Jafon in Jigawa State and 6 INDs who left GSSSS Camp for Galadima in Maiduguri.

Mubi South (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 20 INDs arrived at Monguno from Gwoza and 34 INDs left Gude in Mubi South for Gwoza LGA

Ngala (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 176 INDs arrived at International School Camp Ngala during the reporting period. These include 100 INDs who arrived from Cameroon, 71 INDs who arrived from Wulgo and 5 INDs who arrived from Monguno.

Nganzai (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 576 INDs arrived at Bakasi Camp and 26 INDs left during the reporting period. These include 494 arrivals at Gajiram, 82 arrivals at Bakasi and 26 INDs who left Jigalta ward for nearby Birmari village.

Yola North (Trigger: attack): 32 INDs arrived at Yola North from Numan LGA due to recent attacks in Numan area.

Yola South (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 611 INDs arrived at Wuro-Yanka in Yola South from Numan LGA due to recent attacks in Numan.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.
