
SUMMARY OF MOVEMENTS

Arrivals: 5,337 individuals Departures: 579 individuals


Within the period of 9 – 14 May 2018, a total of 5,916 movements were recorded, including 5,337 arrivals and 579 departures at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Damboa, Demsa, Dikwa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Gubio, Guzamala, Gwoza, Ngala, Hawul, Hong, Kaga, Kala/Balge, Konduga, Kukawa, Madagali, Mafa, Magumeri, Maiduguri, Maiha, Michika, Mobbar, Monguno, Mubi-North, Mubi-South, Ngala, Nganzai, Numan, Yola-North and Yola-South Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Adamawa and Borno States.

Assessments identified the following main triggers of movements: poor living conditions (28%), improved security (26%), voluntary relocation (24%), military operations (12%), fear of attacks (7%), ongoing conflict (2%) and farming activities (1%).

Yobe Update: Yobe Update: Recent updates from Yobe state indicate the arrival of over 235 households (938 individuals) at Kumaganam and Guya wards of Yusufari LGA in Yobe state. The arrivals are reported to have moved to these locations from Niger Republic in April 2018, and are currently residing with host families in Harande and Ganawa communities. The IDPs report poor living conditions and limited access to humanitarian assistance as push factors, and are currently in need of food, health, WASH and NFI support.

NUMBER OF ARRIVALS

Gwoza LGA: 1,224 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA during the reporting period. These include 354 arrivals at Gadamayo town in Gwoza, 310 arrivals at the Transit Camp in Pulka, 309 arrivals at Wakane community from Mubi-South LGA of Adamawa State, 157 arrivals at Bulabulin ward of Gwoza from Maiduguri LGA and 94 arrivals at Hausari ward from Jere LGA. The primary movement triggers for movements recorded in these LGAs include improved security and poor living conditions.

Bama LGA: 1,033 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA during the reporting period. These include 646 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Abbaram/Soye wards of Bama LGA, due to military operations/poor living conditions in Abbaram/Soye, 269 arrivals at Banki Camp from Gulumba/Kumshe wards of Bama and 118 arrivals at Banki Camp from Marwa in Cameroon. The main movement triggers include military operations, voluntary relocation and poor living conditions.

Ngala LGA: 614 arrivals were recorded at Ngala LGA during the reporting period. These include 431 arrivals at Arabic Camp, 85 arrivals at Ngala town from Waza in Cameroon, 64 arrivals at Gamboru town and 34 arrivals at International School Camp. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions, voluntary relocation and military operations.

Biu LGA: 318 arrivals were recorded at Biu LGA during the reporting period. These include 217 arrivals from Wawa/Ajigin ward of Damboa LGA and 101 arrivals at Donchiba ward of Biu from Zara Wiyaku ward of Biu LGA. The main movement triggers include poor living conditions, voluntary relocation and military operations.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.
