






From the period 7 – 13 October 2019, a total of 1,137 movements were recorded, which were composed of 856 arrivals and 281 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Hawul, Kaga, Konduga, Mafa, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno State. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State. Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Dikwa, Gwoza and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno State. Departures were also recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (36%), poor living conditions (33%), military operations (12%), improved security (8%), fear of attack (7%), conflict/attack (2%) and involuntary relocation (1%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Askira/Uba: 132 arrivals and 46 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 28 from Chull/Rumirgo ward and were tracked at Wamdeo/Giwi ward and 68 from Damboa ward of Damboa LGA. Other arrivals include 17 from Gujba LGA of Yobe State, 11 from Karu LGA of Nasarawa State and 8 from Yola South LGA of Adamawa State. The departures include 30 from Askira East ward, 13 from Husara/Tampul ward and 3 from Dille/Huyim ward. 58% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions, 34% due to Fear of attack while 8% relocated voluntarily. 65% of the departures reported to have relocated due to improved security, 28% due to poor living conditions, while 7% relocated voluntarily.

Bama: 117 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 28 from Darajamal ward, 12 from Buduwa/Bula Chirabe ward and 3 from Bulongu ward and were tracked in Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward. Other arrivals include 17 from Bale Galtimari ward of Jere LGA and 10 from Dikwa ward of Dikwa LGA. 21 from Mokolo, 17 from Mora and 9 from Deido of Cameroon. 49% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily, 41% relocated due to military operations while 10% were reportedly involuntary.

Gombi: 58 arrivals and 13 departures were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals include 17 from Mayo Ine ward of Fufore LGA, 15 from Gulak ward of Madagali LGA, 14 from Madzi Ward of Michika LGA and 12 from Gwamba ward of Demsa LGA. The 13 departures were from Gombi South ward. 55% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily while 45% were reportedly due to poor living conditions. The departures were due to poor living conditions.

Damboa: 70 arrivals were recorded in Damboa LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 58 from Azur/Multe/Forfor ward and 12 from Maisandari ward. 89% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to military operations while 48% were reportedly due to poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 65 children of 6-59 months. Of the 65 children screened, the MUAC reading recorded 2 children (1 from accessible and the other from an inaccessible area) in the Red category, 10 in the Yellow category and 53 measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 6 LGAs reports were received from.

The results also include 21 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger (5 children moved to Bama, 6 to Gwoza, 8 to Mobbar and 2 moved to Ngala); out of the 21 children measured, none was in the red category, 15 were in the green category and 6 were in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
