

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Ngala: 205 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 107 from Darak of Cameroon. Other arrivals include 87 from Rann ward of Kala/Balge LGA and 11 from Bolori I ward of Maiduguri Metropolitan Council. All the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions.

Maiduguri: 140 arrivals were recorded in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council of Borno State. The 140 arrivals were from Auno Chabbol ward of Konduga LGA. All the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to military operations.

Girei: 17 arrivals and 73 departures were recorded in Girei LGA of Adamawa State. The 17 arrivals were from Hong ward of Hong LGA. The 73 departures were from Girei I ward. All the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily. 78% of the departures reported to have relocated due poor living conditions while 22% relocated voluntarily.

Askira/Uba: 82 arrivals were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 2 from Old Maiduguri ward of Jere LGA. Other arrivals include 56 from Chull/Rumirgo ward and were tracked at Askira East ward, 15 from Giwi/Womdeo ward and were tracked at Hausara/Tampul ward and 9 from Uba ward and were tracked at Ngohi ward. 68% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to fear of attack, 21% relocated voluntarily while 11% were reportedly due to improved security.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 81 children of 6-59 months. Of the 81 children screened, the MUAC reading recorded 4 children (1 from accessible and 3 from an inaccessible area) in the Red category, 9 in the Yellow category and 68 measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 6 LGAs reports were received from.

The results also include 35 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger (9 children moved to Bama, 2 to Gwoza, 8 to Mobbar and 16 moved to Ngala); Out of the 35 children measured, none was in the red category, 33 in the green category and 2 were in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
