

## SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Askira/Uba: 325 arrivals and 24 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 241 from Chull/Rumirgo ward, 59 from Uba ward and 6 from Uvu/Uda ward. Other arrivals include 5 from Gumsuri/Misakirbutu ward of Damboa LGA, 11 from Maiha LGA of Adamawa State and 3 from Bauchi LGA of Bauchi State. The departures include 18 from Chull/Rumirgo ward and 3 from Husara/Tampul ward. 74% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict/attack, 23% due to improved security, 2% due to poor living conditions while 1% was reportedly voluntarily. 75% of the departures were all due to fear of attack while 25% relocated voluntarily.

Ngala: 211 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno State. The 211 arrivals were from Rann "A" ward of Kala/Balge LGA. The arrivals were all due to poor living conditions.

**Hong:** 153 arrivals and 39 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals include 141 from Thilbang ward and 12 from Gude ward and were tracked in Banshika ward and Daksiri ward respectively. The departures include 22 from Kwarhi ward and 17 from Shangui ward. The arrivals were all due to improved security while the departures relocated voluntarily.

**Bama:** 133 arrivals and 3 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals include 36 from Buduwa/Bula Chirabe ward, 5 from Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward and 2 from Abbaram ward. Other arrivals include 49 from Kolofata, 23 from Mora and 18 from Mokolo of Cameroon. The 3 departures were from Shehuri/Hausari/Mairi ward. 98% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated voluntarily while 2% were due to poor living conditions. The departures reported to have relocated voluntarily.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

## NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using monitoring of symptoms of acute malnutrition mid upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 163 children of 6-59 months. Of the 163 children screened, the MUAC reading recorded 3 children (from an accessible area) in the Red category, 15 in the Yellow category and 145 measured in the Green category. No cases of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that reports were received from.

The results also include 86 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger (34 children moved to Bama, 6 to Gwoza, 11 to Mobbar and the 35 moved to Ngala); of all the 86 children measured, two (2) children were in the red category, 75 in the green category and 9 measured in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment.
