


A total of 2,193 movements were recorded, comprising 1,696 arrivals and 497 departures, between 6 and 12 July 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Bama, Dikwa, Hawul, Kala/Balge and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGAs of Borno; Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (43%), voluntary relocation (19%), fear of attack (14%), conflict/attack (13%) and improved security (10%).

### **SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS**

**78%** IDPs

**Monguno:** 336 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 190 from Kukawa ward and Alagarno ward of Kukawa LGA and 146 from Gajiram ward of Nganzai LGA in Borno state. 59 per cent of the movements were as a result of poor living conditions and 41 per cent were as a result of conflict/attack.

**NIGER REPUBLIC** 

Askira/Uba: 205 arrivals and 32 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 128 from Askira/Uba LGA, 18 from Gwoza, 15 from Biu and 3 from Damboa LGA in Borno state, 22 from Gombi LGA and 19 from Yola North LGA in Adamawa state. The departures recorded were 27 from Kautikari ward of Chibok LGA and 5 from Chul/Rumirgo of Askira/Uba LGA in Borno state. 54 per cent of the movement were triggered by conflict/attack, 37 per cent from improved security, 8 per cent relocated voluntarily and 1 per cent poor living conditions.

**Mobbar:** 219 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 219 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. All movements recorded were as a result of poor living conditions.

**Guyuk:** 146 arrivals and 61 departures were recorded in Guyuk LGA of Adamawa state. All 146 arrivals recorded were from Guyuk LGA in Adamawa state. The departures included 47 from Guyuk LGA and 14 from Lamurde LGA of Adamawa state. 71 per cent of the movements were as a result of fear of attack and 29 per cent were as a result of poor living conditions.

# **NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)**

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 140 children of 6-59 months. Of the 140 children screened, the MUAC reading was 6 children (5 from In- accessible and 1 accessible areas) in the Red category, 14 were in the Yellow category and 120 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 88 children from neighboring countries (14 in Bama, 2 in Gwoza, 59 in Mobbar and 13 in Ngala). Of all the 88 children measured, 1 child was recorded in the Red category, 77 in the Green category and the remaining 10 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
