110 Children (6-59 months) screened for malnutrition





A total of 1,293 movements were recorded, comprising 969 arrivals and 324 departures, between 3 and 9 August 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Michika, Mubi North, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Dikwa, Hawul and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno; Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South and Numan LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (39.2%), voluntary relocation (25.4%), conflict/attack (23.7%), improved security (11.4%) and fear of attack (0.3%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Monguno: 200 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 149 from Gajiram ward in Nganzai LGA, 29 from Kukawa ward in Kukawa LGA and 22 from Gudumbali East ward in Guzamala LGA of Borno state. All movements recorded were triggered by conflict/attack.

Bama: 174 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 113 from Marwa region in Cameroon, 61 from Dipchari/Jere/Dar-Jamal/Kotembe and Sabsabwa/Soye/Nulongu wards in Bama LGA of Borno state. 67 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions while the remaining 33 per cent relocated voluntarily.

Mobbar: 145 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 145 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. 74 per cent of the movements were triggered by conflict/attack and 26 per cent relocated voluntarily.

Gwoza: 112 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 22 from Gwoza, 15 from Bama, 12 from Monguno and 9 from Jere LGAs of Borno state, 19 from Yola North, 12 from Girei and 7 from Fufore LGAs of Adamawa state and 16 from Marwa region in Cameroon. All movements were as a result of poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 110 children of 6-59 months. Of the 110 children screened, the MUAC reading was 7 children (4 from In-accessible and 3 from Accessible areas) in the Red category, 5 were in the Yellow category and 98 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 59 children from neighboring countries (17 in Bama, 3 in Gwoza, 35 in Mobbar and 4 in Ngala). Of all the 59 children measured, 2 children was recorded in the Red category, 54 in the Green category and the remaining 3 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
