# **EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)**


A total of 1,531 movements were recorded, comprising 729 arrivals and 802 departures, between 21 and 27 September 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Bama, Dlkwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South and Numan LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba and Kala Balge LGAs of Borno; Demsa, Fufore, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika and Song LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: conflict/atack (70.3%), voluntary relocation (17.9%), poor living conditions (10.6%) and improved security (1.2%).

## **SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS**

**Askira/Uba:** 722 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. The departures included 683 from Uba, Lassa and Husara/Tampul ward in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state and 39 from Lokuwa ward in Mubi North LGA of Adamawa state. All movements recorded were as a result of conflict/attack.

**Gubio:** 291 arrivals were recorded in Gubio LGA of Borno state. All arrivals were from Gubio I ward in Gubio LGA of Borno state. All movements recorded were triggered by conflict/attack.

**Ngala:** 98 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. All 98 arrivals were from the village of Tetewa in Bul region of Chad. All movements recorded were voluntary.

**Mobbar:** 63 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 63 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. All movements recorded were as a result of voluntary relocation.

### **NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)**

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 78 children of 6-59 months. Of the 78 children screened, the MUAC reading was 4 children (2 from In-accessible and 2 from Accessible areas) in the Red category, 6 were in the Yellow category and 68 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 57 children from neighboring countries (6 in Bama, 2 in Gwoza, 13 in Mobbar and 36 in Ngala). Of all the 57 children measured, 2 children was recorded in the Red category, 51 in the Green category and the remaining 4 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
