Children (6-59 months) screened for malnutrition


MUAC category of screened children



A total of 923 movements were recorded, comprising 722 arrivals and 201 departures, between 9 and 15 November 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Dlkwa, Gwoza, Hawul, Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, Mobbar and Monguno Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba and Bama LGAs of Borno; Girei, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (42.5%), poor living conditions (25.1%), improved security (20.0%), conflict/atack (11.7%) and military operations (0.7%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Bama: 122 arrivals and 1 departure were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 84 from Marwa region in Cameroon, 19 from Bama and Jere respectively. The departure recorded was headed to Konduga. 51 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions and 49 per cent relocated voluntarily.

Monguno: 97 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 79 from Kukawa and 16 from Guzamala LGAs of Borno state and 2 from Kwami LGA of Gombe state. 81 per cent of the movements recorded were as a result of conflict/attack, 16 per cent triggered by poor living conditions while the remaining 2 per cent relocated voluntarily.

Gwoza: 92 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 39 from Marwa region in Cameroon, 15 from Bama and Konduga LGAs respectively and 1 from Gwoza LGA of Borno state, 15 from Gwagwalada LGA of the Federal Capital Teritory, 4 from Maiha LGA of Adamawa state and 3 from Dutse LGA of Jigawa state. 99 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions and 1 per cent relocated as a result of military operations.

Numan: 36 arrivals and 40 departures were recorded in Numan LGA of Adamawa state. The arrivals included 13 from Lau LGA of Taraba state, 9 from Yola North, 7 from Yola South and Fufore LGAs respectively of Adamawa state. The departures recorded were 22 to Demsa and 18 to Lamurde LGAs of Adamawa state. 59 per cent relocated voluntarily, 24 per cent as a result of improved security and the remaining 17 per cent relocated as a result of poor living conditions.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 82 children of 6-59 months. Of the 82 children screened, the MUAC reading was none in the Red category, 3 were in the Yellow category and 79 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 40 children from neighboring countries (27 in Bama, 4 in Gwoza and 9 in Mobbar). Of all the 40 children measured, none was recorded in the Red category, 39 in the Green category and the remaining 1 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
