

DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements






A total of 2,042 movements were recorded, comprising 1,744 arrivals and 298 departures, between 7 and 13 December 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Dikwa, Gwoza, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Damboa and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno; Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Maiha, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan and Song LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (48.7%), poor living conditions (23.4%), improved security (14.2%), conflict/atack (13.0%) and fear of attack (0.7%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Askira/Uba: 445 arrivals and 81 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 235 from Geidam LGA of Yobe state, 206 from Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state and 4 from Akko LGA of Gombe state. The departures recorded included 74 to Askira/Uba and 7 to Damboa LGAs of Borno state. 45 per cent relocated voluntarily, 28 per cent of the movements recorded were as a result of improved security, 26 per cent due to conflict/attack and 1 per cent due to poor living conditions.

Gwoza: 328 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 163 from Marwa region in Cameroon, 47 from Askira/Uba, 32 from Jere, 4 from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGAs of Borno state and 39 from Yola North, 31 from Mubi North and 12 from Maiha LGAs of Adamawa state. 61 per cent of the movements recorded were triggered by poor living conditions and the remaining 39 per cent relocated as a result of conflict/attack.

Ngala: 160 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 90 from Rann "A" ward in Kala/Balge LGA of Borno state and 70 from Marwa region in Cameroon. All of the movements recorded were triggered by voluntary relocation.

Bama: 145 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 77 from Bama LGA of Borno state and 68 from Marwa region in Cameroon. 53 per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions and 47 per cent were as a result of voluntary relocation.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 199 children of 6-59 months. Of the 199 children screened, the MUAC reading was 4 children (2 from In-accessible and 2 from accessible areas) in the Red category, 12 were in the Yellow category and 183 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 5 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 47 children from neighboring countries (13 in Bama, 9 in Gwoza, 11 in Mobbar and 14 in Ngala). Of all the 47 children measured, 1 was recorded in the Red category, 41 in the Green category and the remaining 5 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
