EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and to collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the Mobility Tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilises direct observation and a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.




Departures: 506 individuals

Between 13 and 19 December 2021, a total of 5,791 movements were recorded in the states of Adamawa and Borno. The recorded movements consisted of 5,285 arrivals and 506 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Damboa, Gwoza, Hawul, Kala/Balge, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected state of Borno and in Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Kala/Balge and Konduga LGAs of Borno, and Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: camp closure/government-assisted relocation (2,380 individuals or 41%), voluntary relocation (1,714 individuals or 30%), poor living conditions (634 individuals or 11%), conflicts/attacks (452 individuals or 8%), improved security (438 individuals or 8%), fear of attacks (90 individuals or 1%) and seasonal farming (83 individuals or 1%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Gwoza: 2,372 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 1,994 individuals from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State, 209 individuals from within Gwoza LGA, 120 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon, 40 individuals from Bama LGA in Borno State and 9 individuals from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State. Eighty-five per cent of the movements recorded were due to camp closure / government-assisted relocation, 14 per cent of the movements were triggered by conflicts/attacks.

Bama: 1,085 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 856 individuals from within Bama LGA and 229 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. Eighty-eight per cent of the movements recorded were due to voluntary relocation and 12 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions.

Ngala: 352 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno State. All arrivals were from the Marwa region in Cameroon. All movements recorded were a result of conflicts/attacks in area of origin.

Monguno: 326 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 231 individuals from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State, 74 individuals from the Diffa region in Niger and 21 individuals from Jere LGA in Borno State. Seventy-one per cent of the movements recorded were due to camp closure / government-assisted relocation, 23 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditons and 6 per cent of the movements were due to voluntary relocation.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners on the ground.
