EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and to collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the Mobility Tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilises direct observation and a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.







Between 20 and 26 December 2021, a total of 3,875 movements were recorded in the states of Adamawa and Borno. The recorded movements consisted of 3,381 arrivals and 494 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, Kala/Balge, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected state of Borno and in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Kala/Balge and Konduga LGAs of Borno, and Fufore, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Song and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (1,498 individuals or 39%), conflicts/attacks (944 individuals or 24%), camp closure/government-assisted relocation (877 individuals or 23%), poor living conditions (349 individuals or 9%), improved security (112 individuals or 3%), fear of attacks (59 individuals or 1%) and seasonal farming (36 individuals or 1%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Bama: 1,232 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 965 individuals from within Bama LGA and 267 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. All movements recorded were due to voluntary relocation.

Gwoza: 953 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 772 individuals from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State, 109 individuals from Bama LGA in Borno State, 41 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State and 31 individuals from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State. Eighty-one per cent of the movements recorded were due to camp closure / government-assisted relocation and 19 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions.

Askira/Uba: 627 arrivals and 289 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 623 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA and 4 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 274 individuals to Chibok LGA in Borno State and 15 individuals to Gombi LGA in Adamawa State. Ninety-three per cent of the movements recorded were a result of conflicts/attacks in areas of origin, 3 per cent of the movements were triggered by fear of attacks, 2 per cent of the movements were due topoor living conditions and 2 per cent of the movements were due to voluntary relocation.

Monguno: 107 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 105 individuals from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State and 2 individuals from Jere LGA in Borno State. Ninety-eight per cent of the movements recorded were due to camp closure / government-assisted relocation and 2 per cent of the movements were due to voluntary relocation.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's north-eastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners on the ground.
