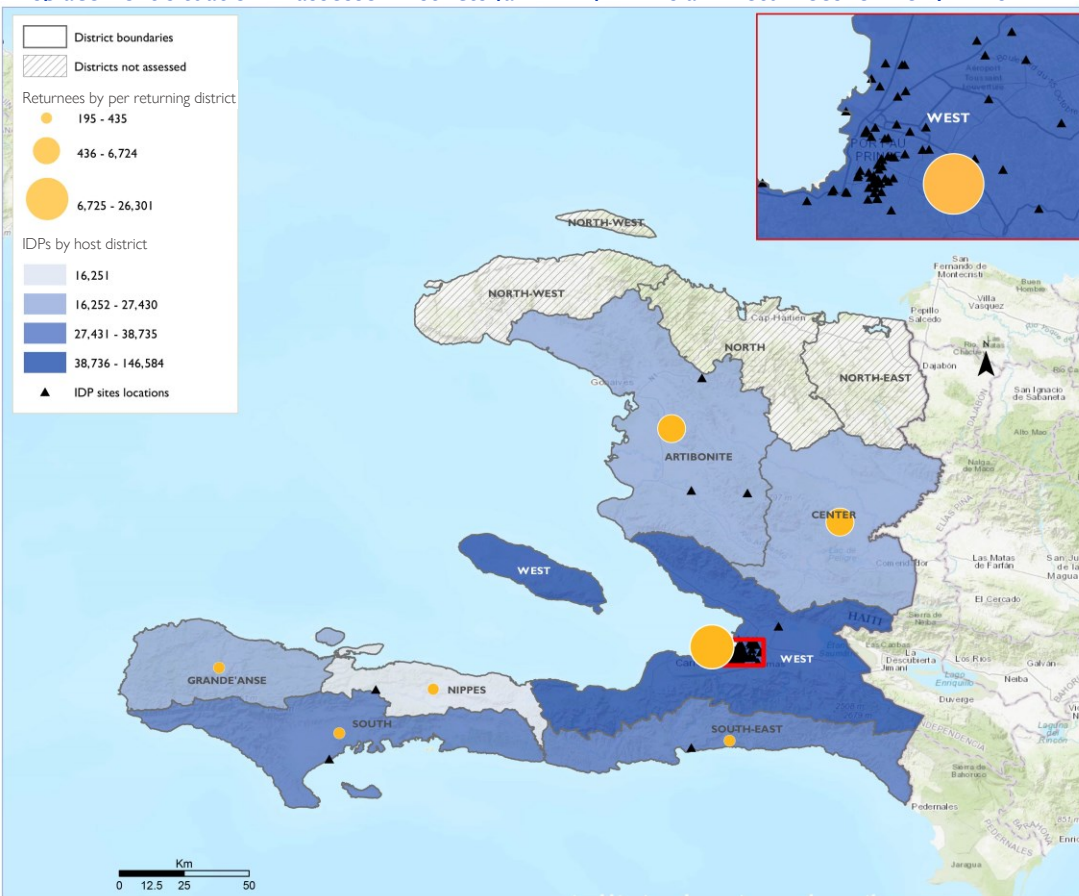

It should be noted that previous data collections focused on the West, Centre and Artibonite departments. At the end of 2023, assessments were extended to the districts of South, South-East, Grande Anse and Nippes. This allowed to gather figures for displaced people hosted in these departments.

**59%** of IDPs were displaced in 2023, especially between June and October 2023

- 94% of IDPs came from areas located in the Western district
- In particular for the municipality of Port-au-Prince (48% of IDPs came from this municipality)
- All IDPs in the Western district came from the same district
- 89% of IDPs in provincial districts came from the Western district, especially from the PAPMA (Port-au-Prince Metropolitan Area)
- In fact, 147,000 persons have left the PAPMA (in the Western district) to take refuge in provincial districts

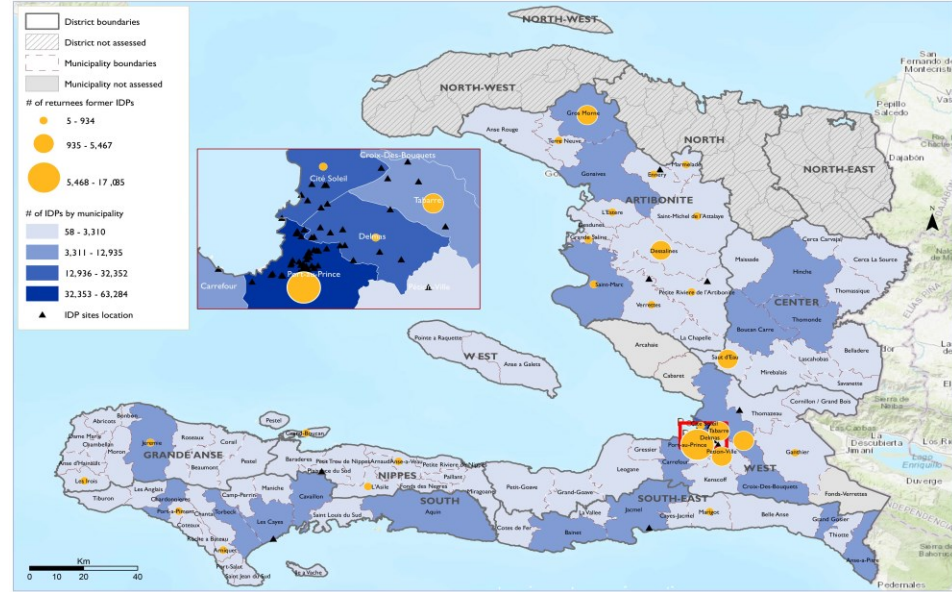

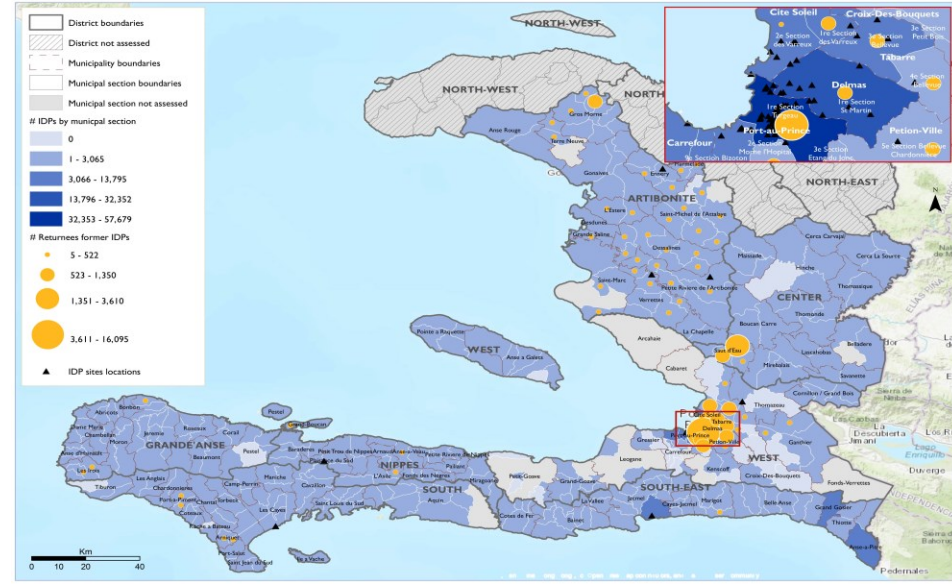

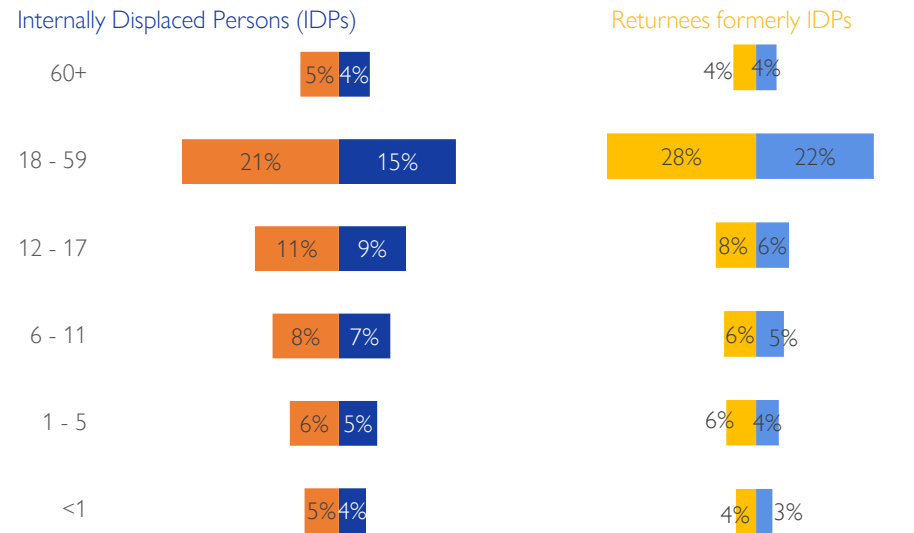

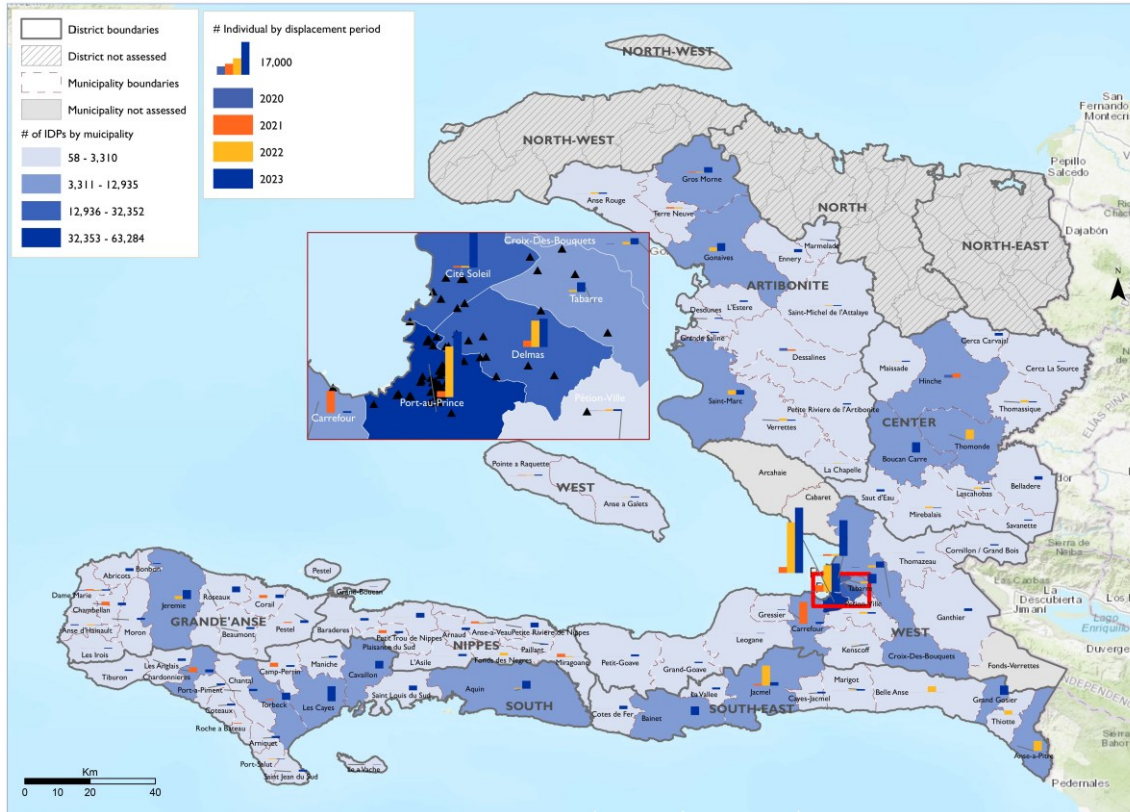


## Disaggregation per age and sex

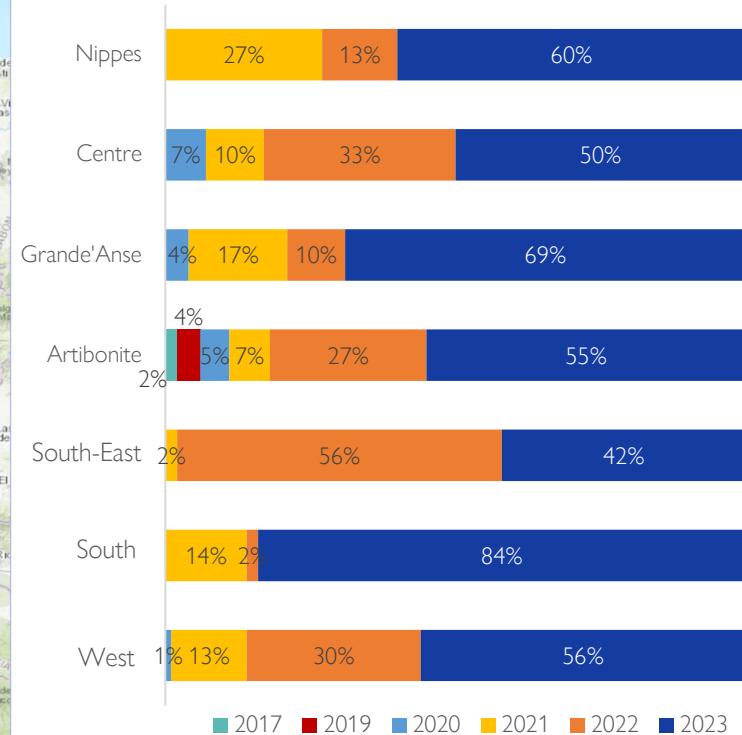

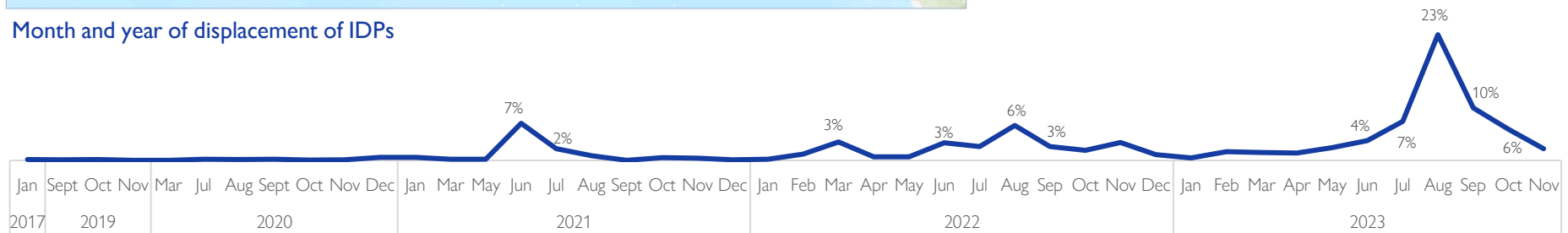
Year of displacement of IDPs by host municipality



Year of displacement of IDPs by host district



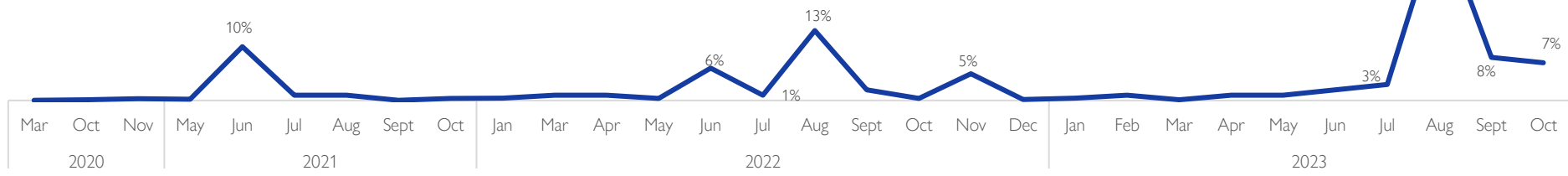
Month and year of displacement of IDPs



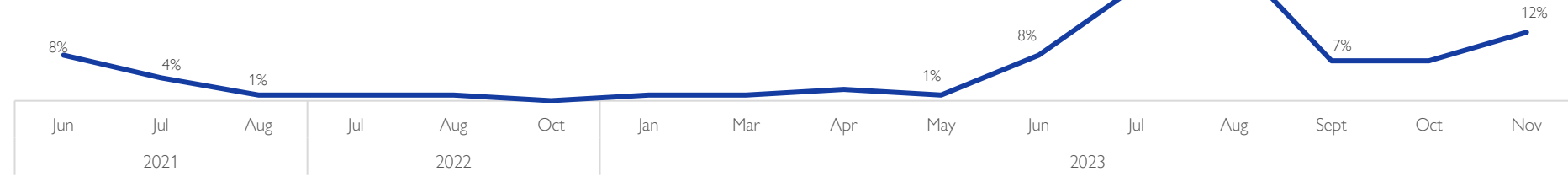

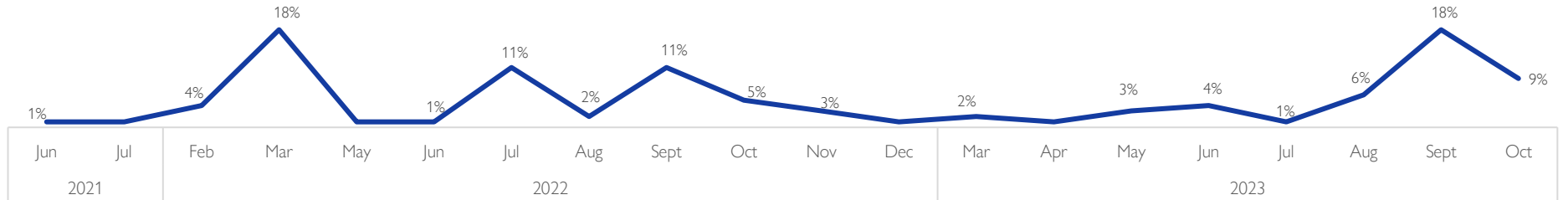

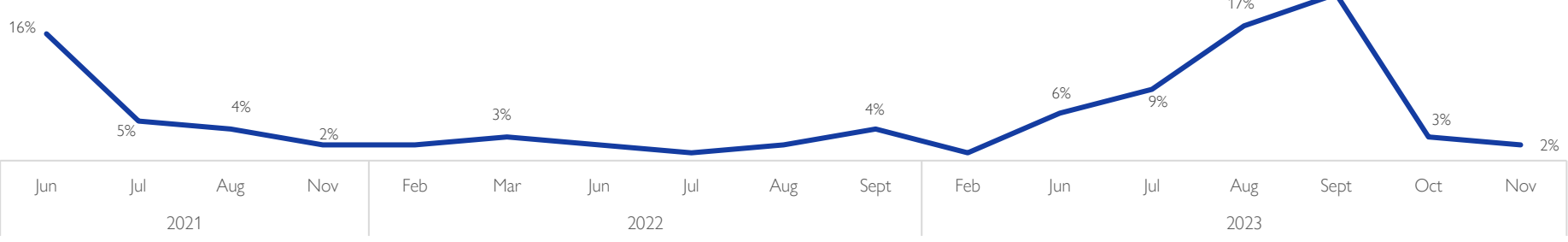

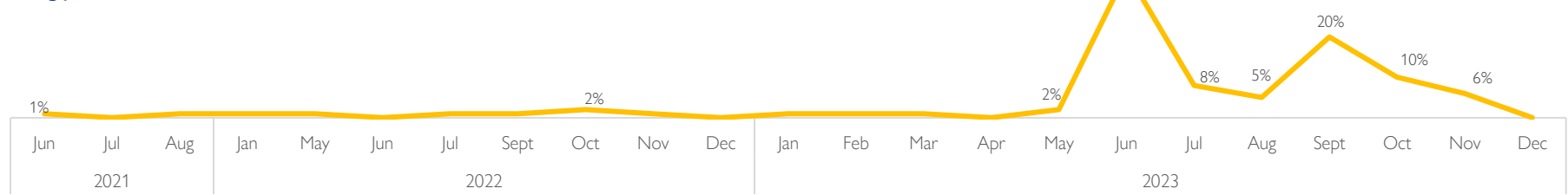
Returning year of returnees by municipality of return



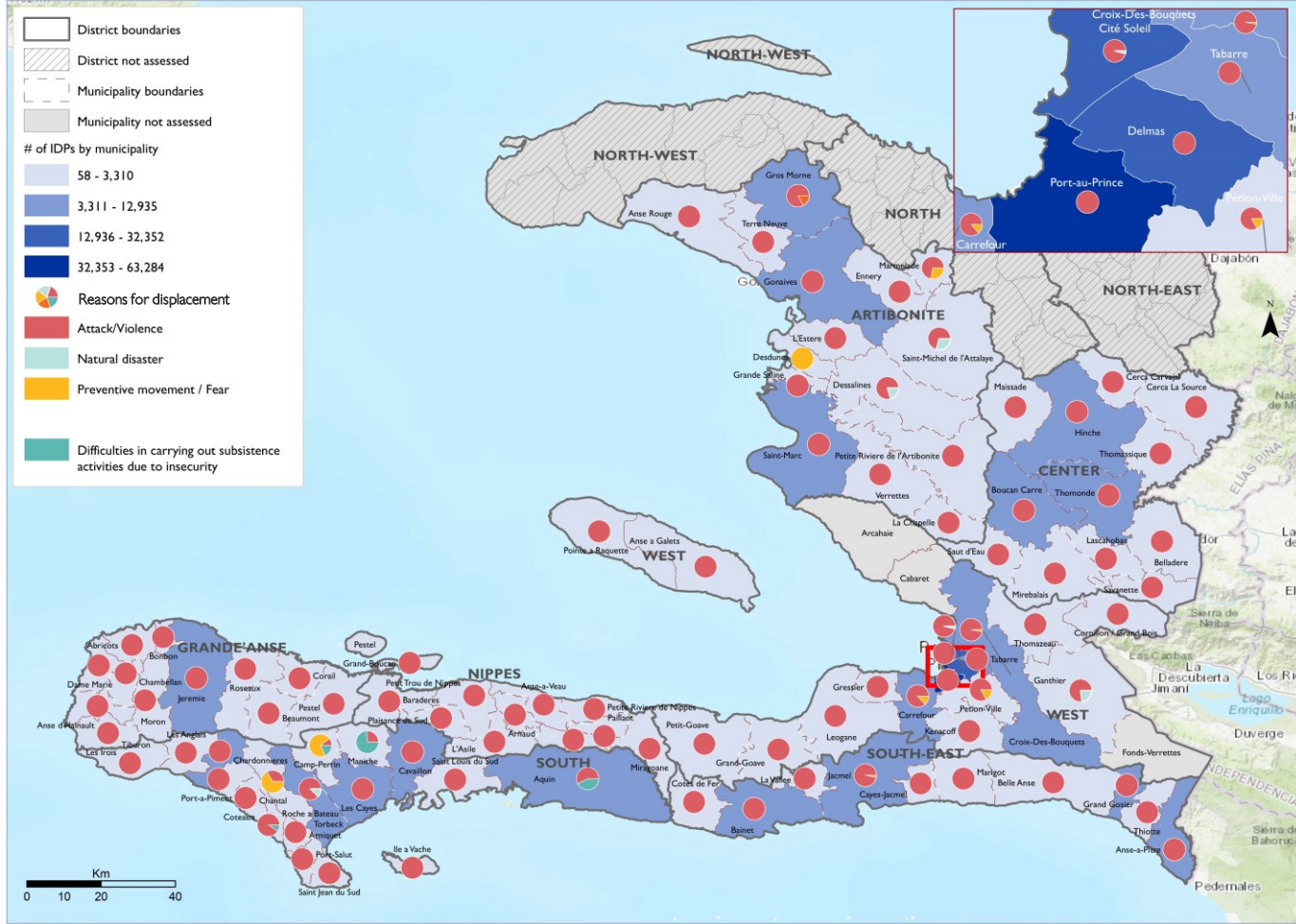
Returning year of returnees by district of return

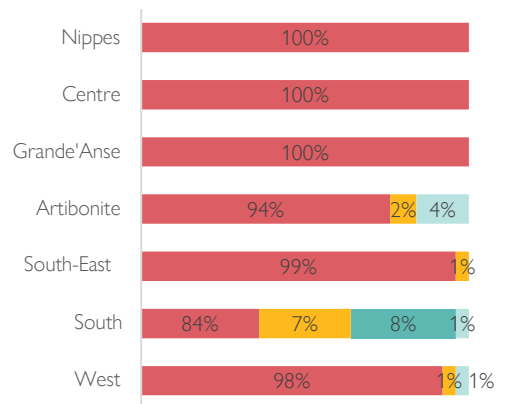

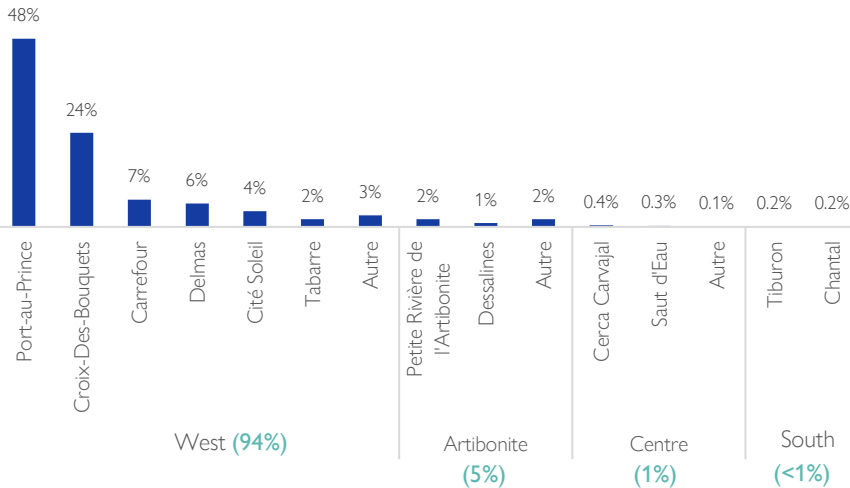

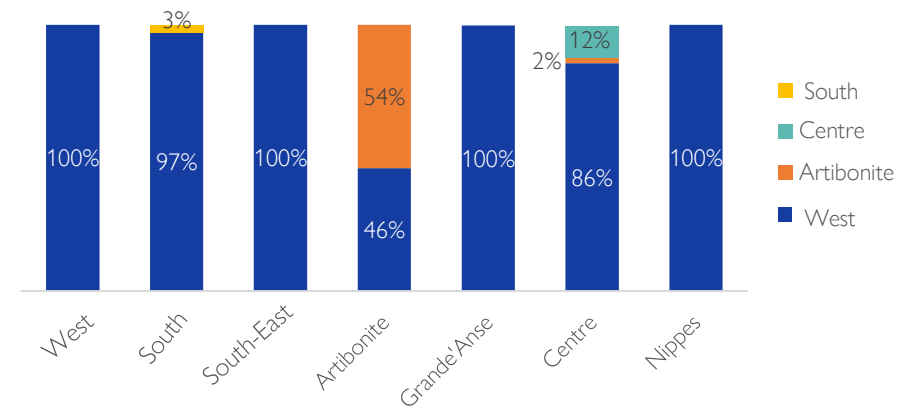

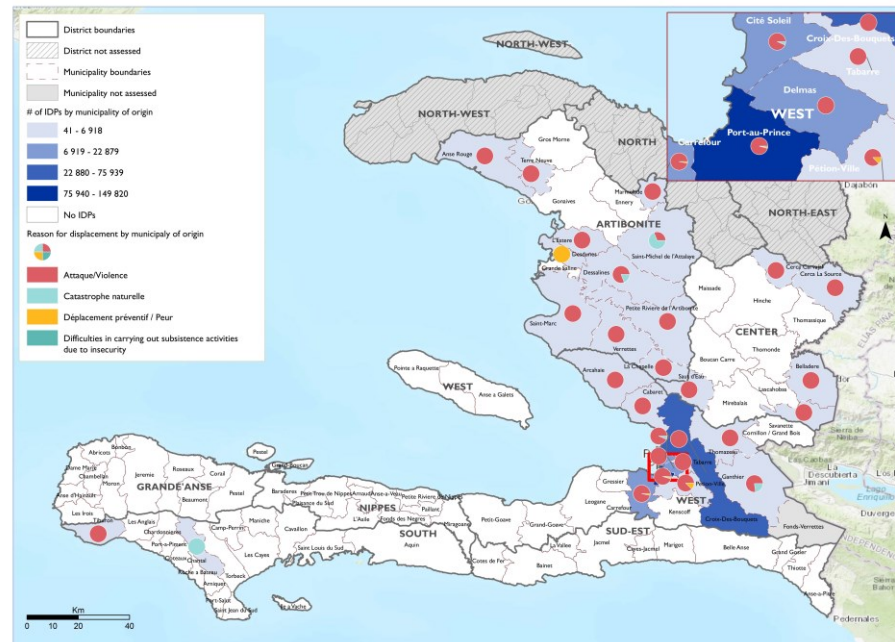

## District of provenance by host district



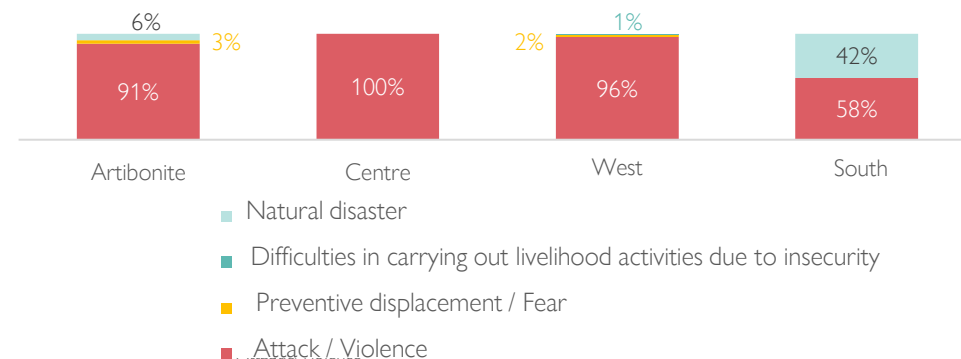
## Reasons for displacement by municipality of provenance



Areas located in the West district were the provenance of the vast majority of IDPs (94%). Except for Artibonite, where 54% of IDPs came from areas of this same district and 46% from the West, IDPs hosted in all other districts largely came from the West district, particularly from the Port-au-Prince Metropolitan Area (see next page for more details on the municipalities of origin).

Thus, all of IDPs in the West, the South-East, Grande Anse and Nippes came from the West department as well as 97% of IDPs in the South and 86% of those in the Centre.

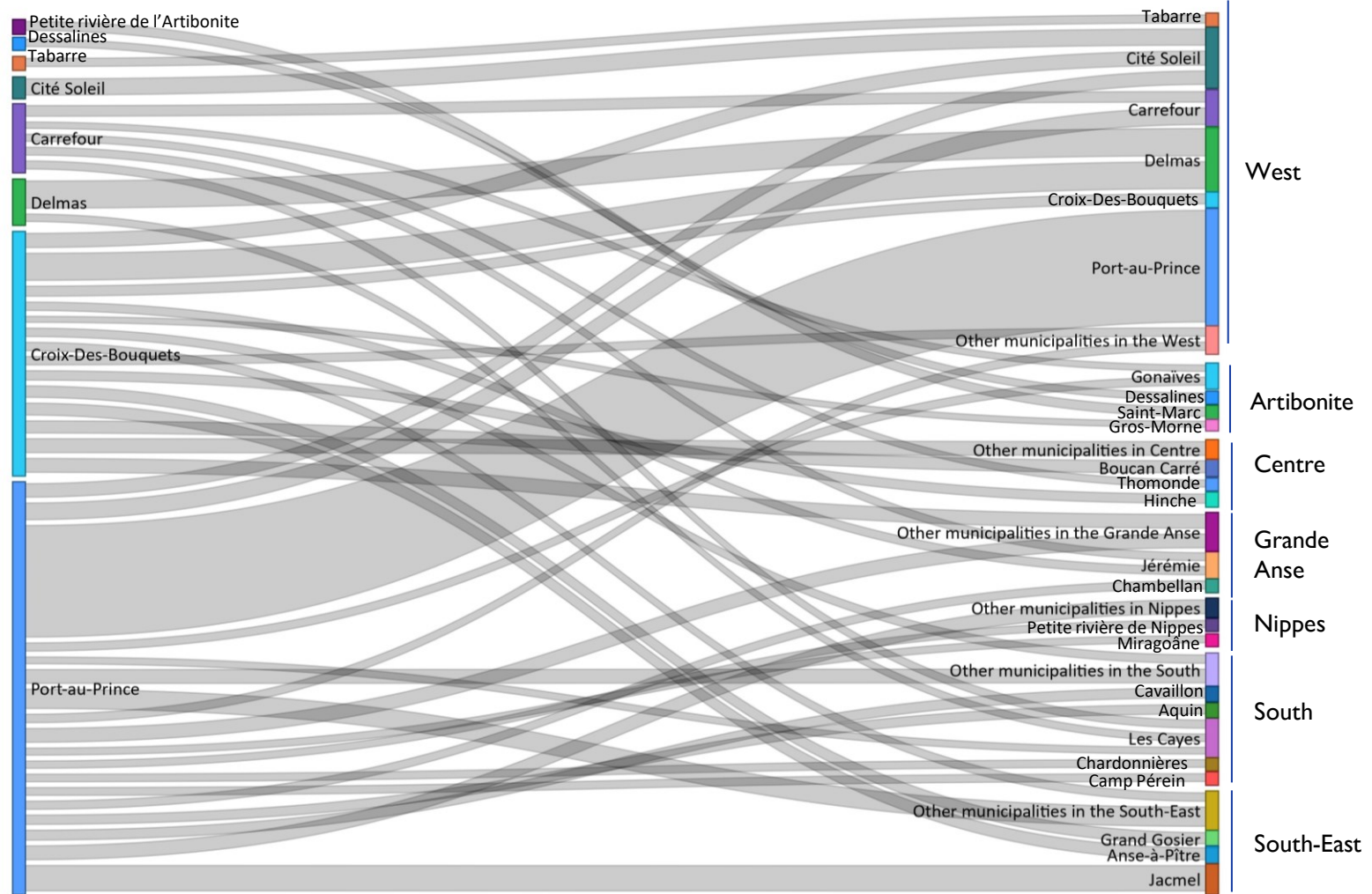
## Reasons for displacement by district of provenance





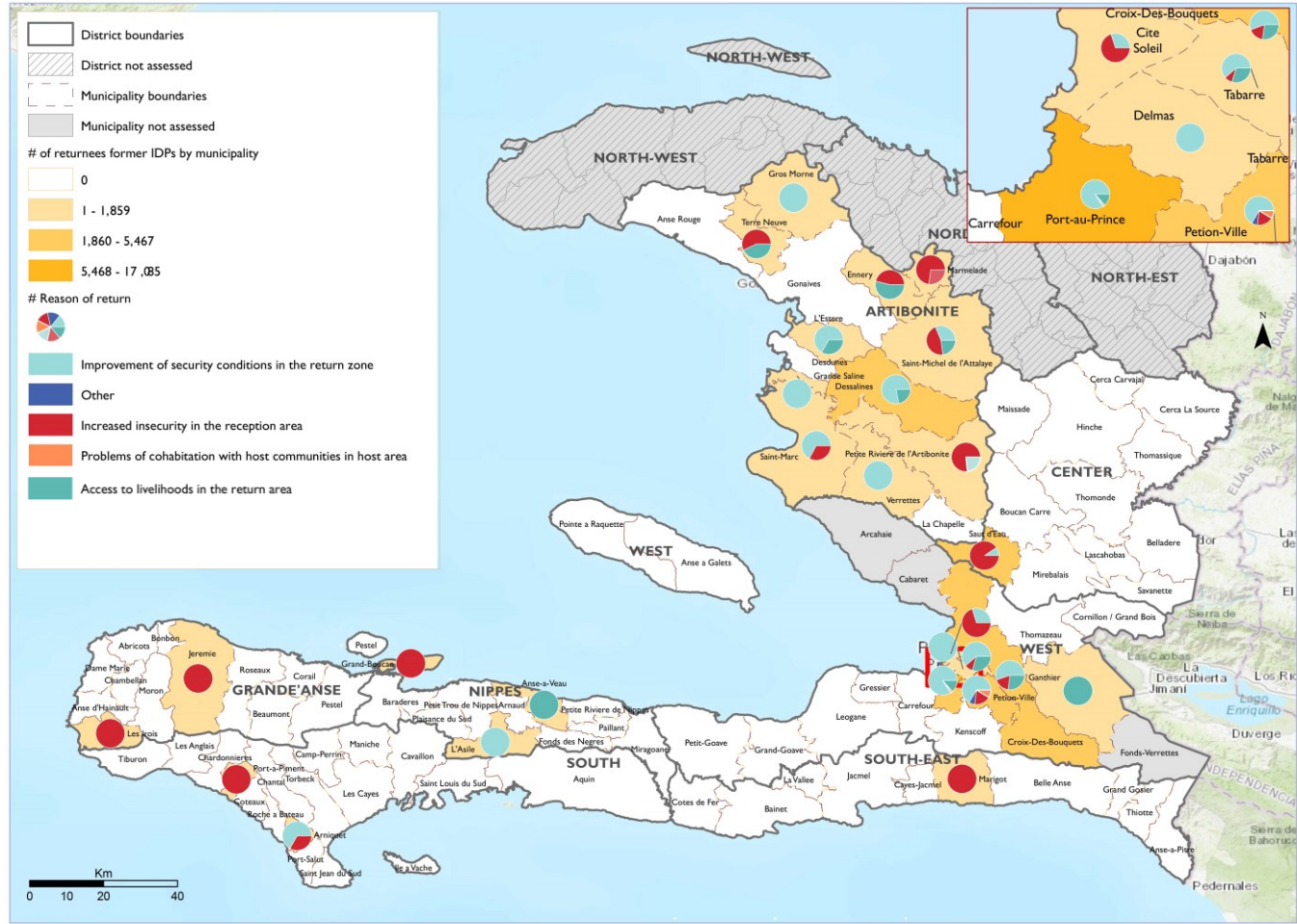
## Main municipalities of provenance of IDPs

## Host municipalities of IDPs



Municipalities in the PAPMA (namely Port-au-Prince, Croix-des-Bouquets, Carrefour, Delmas, Cité Soleil, Tabarre and Pétiön-Ville) constituted the provenance of 92% of all IDPs (nearly 290,000 persons). Of these, 139,853 persons were displaced within the PAPMA ([for more details, see the Round 5 report on the displacement situation in the West, particularly in the PAPMA](#)). And 146,667 IDPs left the PAPMA to take refuge in areas located in provincial districts and 2,656 left for areas located in the West but outside the PAPMA, such as municipalities of Petit Goâve (1,025 IDPs), Grand-Goâve (609), Gressier (340), Kenscoff (272), Léogâne (105), Cornillon / Grand Bois (215) and Thomazeau (90).

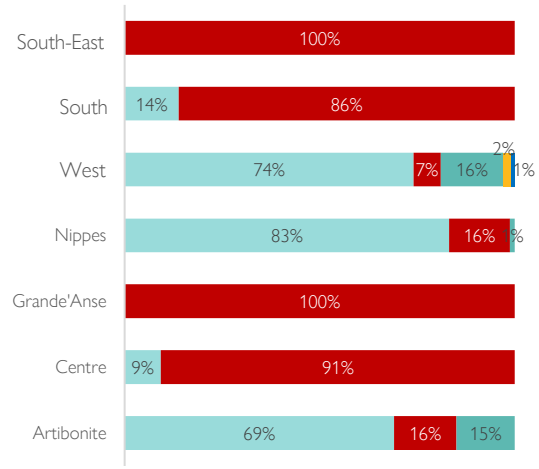
