Situation Overview


Tropical Cyclone Idai made landfall in central Mozambique the night of 14 March 2019. According to the Government of Mozambigue, more than 602 people have died and more than 1,641 have been injured in the aftermath of the storm.

As of 09 April 2019, according to Mozambique's National Institute of Disaster Management (INGC), 73,740 individuals (14,327 families) have been displaced and taken shelter in evacuation centres in the four provinces of Sofala (37), Zambezia (3), Tete (5) and Manica (43). The majority of these centres are schools and churches.


According to government reports, 111,163 houses have been completely destroyed, 112,735 houses have been partially destroyed and 15,784 have been flooded.

The data in this report has been compiled from secondary sources, including the Government of Mozambique. IOM will continue to work closely with the Government to provide regular updates.
