Between 10 to 21 May 2024, attacks and fear of attacks by Non-state Armed Groups in Macomia and Quissanga triggered the cumulative displacement of 4,521 individuals/1,351 families. The current Movement Alert #114 reports on most recent attacks in Northern Cabo Delgado. Macomia attacks | 4,274 | Individuals displaced (10 to 21 May 2024)

Within the reporting period, attacks and the fear of attacks by Non-State Armed Groups in Macomia led to the displacement of 4,274 individuals. The affected families have sought refuge in displacement sites and host communities in the districts of Meluco, Metuge, Chiúre, Ibo, Ancuabe Muidumbe and Cidade de Nampula. Within displacement sites, 628 families with 2,373 individuals have taken refuge in Chiúre (Muajaja and Namissir Camps), 81 families with 220 individuals have taken refuge in Ancuabe (Ngeue, Natove, Cujupane and Nankumi centers), Quissanga (Manicane centre), and Muidumbe (Lutete centre). A total of 587 families (representing 1,681 individuals) are displaced to host communities within neighbourhoods of Meluco (Bairro Iba), Metuge (Ngura, Bairro 1 de Maio, Bairro 7 de Abril, Bairro 10 Congresso), Chiure (Vila de Chiúre), Ibo (Vila do Ibo) and Cidade de Pemba (Bairro Natite). Movements within Macomia and sorrounding districts remain fluid.

Quissanga: fear of attacks | 247 Individuals displaced (20 to 21 May 2024)

Within the reporting period, fear of attacks by Non-State Armed Groups in Quissanga led to the displacement of 247 individuals. The affected families have sought refuge in displacement sites in the districts of Chiúre. Within displacement sites, 55 families whith 247 individuals have taken refuge in Chiúre (Namissir Camp). Movements within Macomia and sorrounding districts remain fluid.

Owing to prevailing security concerns in the region reported by displaced families, intentions on duration of their stay in current locations of displacement sites and host communities remains uncertain. The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) - Movement Alert is to collect information on large and sudden population movements, providing humanitarian response partners with data on IDPs to support effective humanitarian response. Information is collected through key informants' interviews or direct observation. This alert provides basic information on displacements, and additional information can be shared upon request.











