

Fear of attacks, following confirmed attacks by Non-State Armed Groups in Montepuez district (in M'Pupene locality on the 19th and 20th of October) triggered a displacement of 1,824 individuals, arriving in Montepuez sede. An estimate of 26 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) have been identified with vulnerabilities in this group. This is the first time that the individuals in this group have been displaced. The main reported need of the group are for Food, Water, and Shelter.

The IDPs have indicated that the route used is not safe for travelling, and that they are unsure if they are going to remain in the Sede or move elsewhere. Currently they are in the host community.

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) - Movement Alert is to collect information on large and sudden population movements, and to provide support to the humanitarian response partners by disseminating data on IDPs to support effective humanitarian response to the affected population. Information is collected through key informants interviews or direct observation. This dashboard provides basic information on displacements, and additional information can be shared upon request.

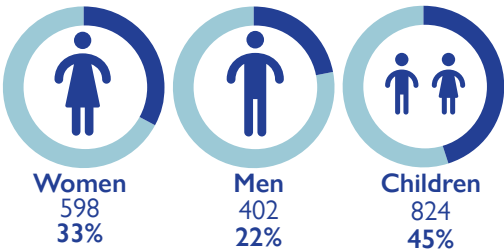

## URGENT NEEDS

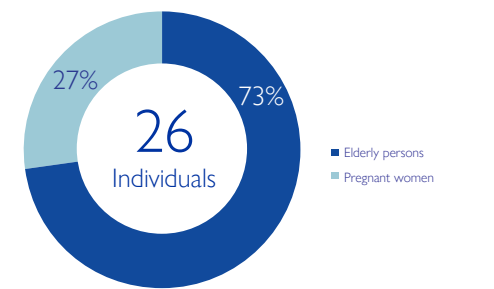


Urgent needs are calculated by weighting the total number of IDP arrivals in each group against the stated priority needs.
