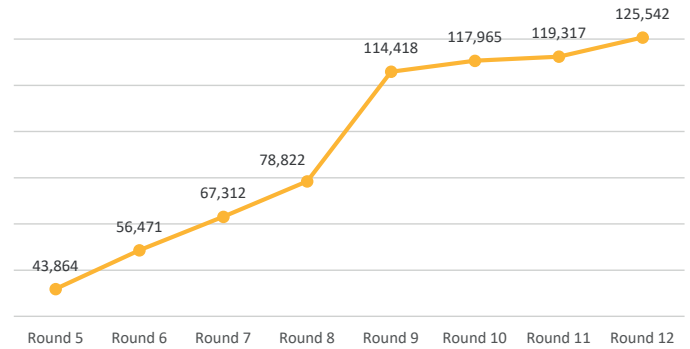
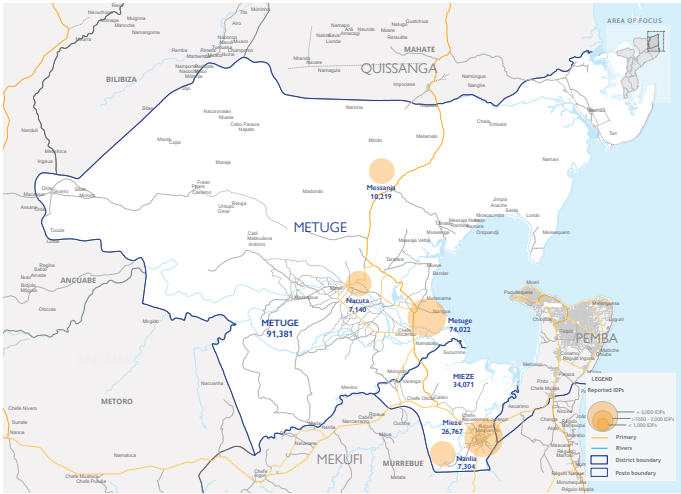

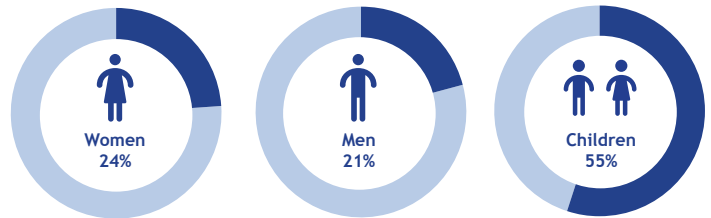


Map of Metuge district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

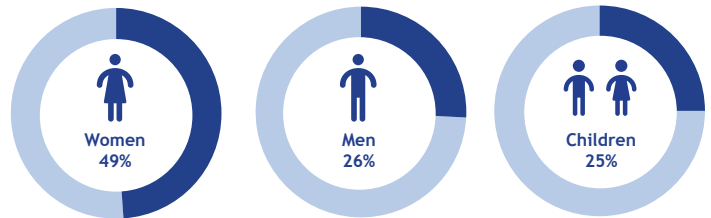


Map of Chiure district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

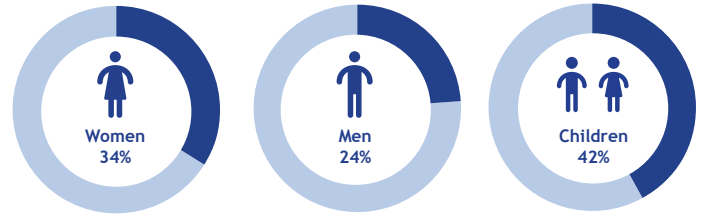


Map of Pemba district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

Montepuez district

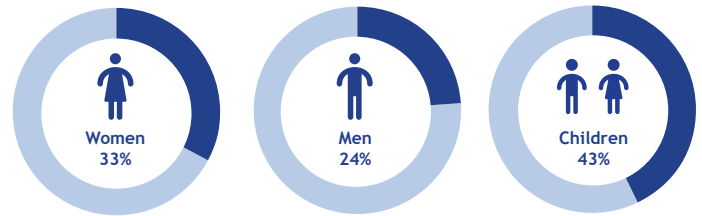


Map of Montepuez district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

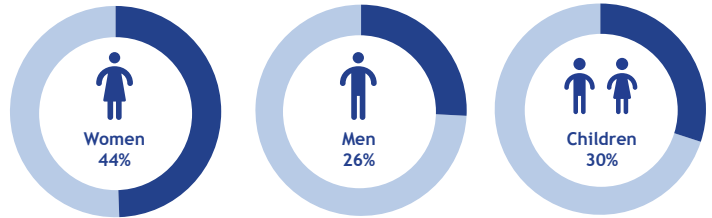


Map of Ancuabe district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

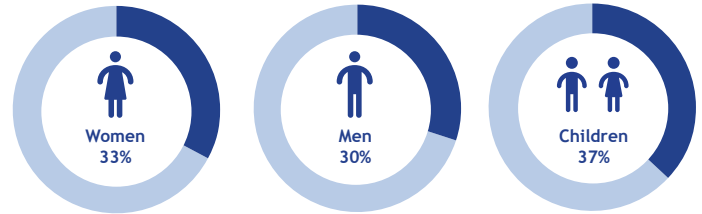


Map of Nangade district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

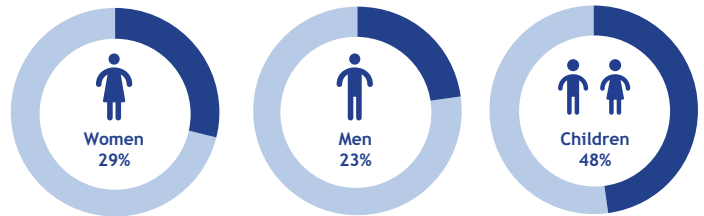


Map of Mueda district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

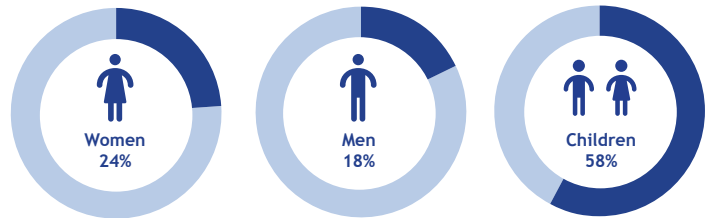


Map of Balama district with total population of IDPs present on sites (left), and graph showing progression of total IDP population in the district (in sites and host communities) (right).

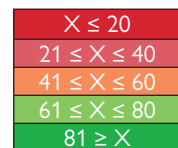
