

The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic at the beginning of 2020 has affected global and regional mobility, including mobility in the DTM REMAP project countries, through various travel disruptions and restrictions.

To better understand how the pandemic affects global mobility, the International Organization for Migration (IOM) developed an online tool and database to register points of entry, exit and transit - such as airports and land and blue border crossing points - where mobility restrictions and preparedness and response measures are in place. To support these efforts, over a period of 18 months, the Displacement Tracking Matrix Regional Evidence for Migration Analysis and Policy (DTM REMAP) national teams mapped and gathered data on the locations, statuses and restrictions at Points of Entry (PoE) in the project countries.

The information gathered allows more in-depth analysis to uncover specific trends related to the locations, statuses and restrictions of PoEs in these countries.


During the reporting period, the number of assessed PoEs in the DTM REMAP project countries gradually increased from 155 to 209¹ PoEs.

The most common type of PoE reported in August 2021 was land borders (111), followed by airports (73) and blue borders (25). Areas of interest, populations of interest and internal transit points were also assessed but were not taken into account for further analysis in this snapshot.





Timeline of confirmed national COVID-19 cases (weekly change) by country and status of PoEs










16 August 2021

Government closes border with India for 14 days and reopens shops and malls Passenger movement through land borders with India remains restricted until 9 May 2021 Government extends ban on land border movement with India (on 14 June 2021 further extended to 30 June 2021) Due to Eid al-Adha festivity, the complete lockdown established on 01 July 2021 is lifted. It is reinstated after Eid on 23 July 2021 Government imposes complete lockdown across the country until 15 July 2021, due to outbreak of COVID-19 delta variant

Lockdown is lifted and passenger movement across land borders with India is permitted from 14 August 2021







GOI removes ban on entry from certain countries. Establishes mandatory COVID-19 testing and quarantine OR full vaccination to travel

KRG closes cafes, clubs and bars 00:01-6:00 and cinemas completely. Mandatory COVID-19 testing to enter from other Iraqi governorates

GOI reduces nighly curfew imposed on 18 February 2021 to 21:00-5:00 Mon-Thu, maintains full curfew Fri-Sun, allows malls, markets and dining places to reopen and bans entry of all tourists

GOI imposes use of masks in public spaces, closes markets and malls, allows dining places to serve outdoors, prohibits gatherings in confined spaces and travel between FI and KRI Thu-Sat

GOI imposes restrictions for Ramadan (14 April-14 May 2021): full lockdown Fri-Sat and 20:00-5:00 Sun-Thu, mandatory COVID-19 testing or full vaccination to enter public offices and schools back online

GOI eases Ramadan restrictions: reopens selected businessess and allows free movement of residents in Baghdad 6:00-19:00

GOI imposes lockdown 12-22 May 2021: curfew and mandatory closure of most businesses

GOI lifts full lockdown imposed two days earlier and establishes curfew 21:00-6:00. Dining and leisure centres remain closed during Eid al-Fitr Rockets hit Erbil International Airport


GOI modifies nightly curfew 23:00-5:00. Dining places and leisure centres required to remain closed


