# Situation Report, September 2017

#### OVERVIEW OF MIGRANT SITUATION IN TURKEY


According to the latest available figures from the Turkish Directorate General for Migration Management (DGMM) currently there are approximately **3,5 million foreign nationals** present in Turkish territory seeking for the international protection.

Most of them are Syrians **3,208,131**\* who are granted with the temporary protection (TP) status, while according to UNHCR another greater group of the foreign nationals seeking Turkish humanitarian and international protection are **324,115**\*\* asylum-seekers and refugees consisting of different nationalities, but mainly coming from Iraq, Afghanistan, Iran, Somalia and other countries.

In addition, there are **591,982\*** foreign nationals under residence permit holder status including humanitarian residence holders.




# Syrians under Temporary Protection

#### **ASYLUM-SEEKERS AND REFUGEES**

Another greater group other than Syrians who are under TP that requires international protection in Turkey is **324,115** asylum-seekers and refugees consisting of different nationalities, but mainly coming from Iraq, Afghanistan, Iran, Somali and other countries.

#### **TEMPORARY PROTECTION**

Turkey implements a **Temporary Protection regime for 3,208,131 from Syria** which grants beneficiaries right to legal stay as well as some level of access to basic rights and services. A vast majority of them **2,978,978** individuals, live outside the camps and are spread across the Turkish border provinces while nearly **229,153** live in 22 camps also majority of them are close to the border with Syria.

#### **RESIDENCE PERMIT HOLDERS**

Foreigners who stay in Turkey beyond the duration of a visa or a visa exemption or, longer than ninety days should obtain a residence permit. There are **591,982** residence permit holders in Turkey within various categories of the residence permit. The "other" residence permit category includes Humanitarian Residence permit holders but the exact number is unknown. It is believed that vast majority of this category are Iraqi nationals.

### APPREHENDED/ RESCUED MIGRANTS ON SEA

According to Turkish Coast Guard (TCG) Reports, the Turkish Coast Guard has apprehended **3,408** irregular migrants and has **24** registered fatalities in the month of September 2017.





## READMITTED MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES TO TURKEY UNDER EU-TURKEY AGREEMENT

Since 4 April, 2016 there are **<u>1,335</u>** migrants and refugees readmitted to Turkey from Greece. The main exit points in Greece include Lesvos, Chios, Kos and Samos and the main entry points to Turkey include Dikili, Çeşme, Güllük/Bodrum and Adana. (through the airport).






RESETTLEMENT OF SYRIANS FROM TURKEY UNDER ONE-TO-ONE MECHANISM

Since April 4, a **total number of 10,020 Syrians** were resettled to the below mentioned countries according to One-to-One mechanism with the assistance of IOM.

#### **APPREHENDED MIGRANTS ON LAND**

According to Turkish Armed Forces (TAF) sources, within the month of September 2017, TAF has registered a total number of **58,669** irregular border crossings which **55,086** of them entering Turkey from Syria, Iraq, Iran, Greece and Nakhichevan and has registered **3,583** irregular crossings from Turkey into Greece, Bulgaria, Syria, Iran and Iraq. The numbers per borders can be seen in the below chart.
