


Biometric Registration Update and Verification North-East Nigeria - Stadium Camp (Maiduguri), Borno State

Following the completion of biometric registration update and verification at Stadium Camp in Maiduguri Metropolitan Council (MMC) in the northeastern state of Borno, 18,151 individuals (3,472 households) have been registered as per 14 April 2021. The average family size within this camp is 5 individuals. As demonstrated in the figure 2, 12 per cent of households contain 1-2 members, 29 per cent containing 3-4 members, 33 per cent containing 5-6 members, 17 per cent containing 7-8 members, 4 per cent containing 9 members and 5 per cent containing 10 and more members.

Between 29 March and 14 April 2021, 12,280 individuals (in 2,837 households), representing 68 per cent of the total registered population were re-verified. 5,871 individuals (in 635 households), representing 32 per cent of the total registered population were newly registered. The majority or 59 per cent of the newly registered individuals are from Kukawa LGA, 35 per cent are from Konduga LGA, 4 per cent from Bama LGA and the remaining 2 per cent from other LGAs within and outside Borno.




Fig. 3 Major Vulnerabilities

During the exercise, data on vulnerabilities was collected in order to understand the specific needs of the displaced populations and allow for targeted support. Out of the total population, 1,783 individuals (10%) are experiencing some of the major vulnerability concerns presented in figure 3 below.


MOVEMENTS FROM OTHER CHECKPOINTS INTO STADIUM CAMP MAIDUGURI

From ARABIC VILLAGE CAMP NGALA: 421 STADIUM CAMP MAIDUGURI: 707 From G.S.S.S.S IDP CAMP BAMA: 203 From TEACHERS VILLAGE CAMP MAIDUGURI: 69 From HAUSARI HOST COMMUNITY GWOZA: 14

During the update and verification exercise which took place from 29 March to 14 April 2021, it was discovered that 707 individuals moved from other checkpoints within and outside Maiduguri Metropolitan Council (MMC) to Stadium Camp Maiduguri in search of humanitarian assistance whenever there was distribution.

Out of the movements captured, 421 individuals (59%) were from Arabic Village Camp in Ngala LGA, 203 individuals (29%) from GSSSS IDP Camp in Bama LGA, 69 individuals (10%) from Teachers Village (Maiduguri) and 14 individuals (2%) were from Hausari Host Community in Gwoza LGA.

RETURN INTENTION / PLACE OF RETURN



A survey on return intentions was also carried out during the period to determine the number of displaced populations who are willing to return to their initial place of displacement and places of origin provided there is security and access to better services, etc. Four per cent of the displaced populations are not willing to return, while the remaining 96 per cent said they are willing to return.

Out of the 96 per cent willing to return, a majority (68%) would like to go back to their place of initial displacement, 27 per cent would prefer a return to their place of origin and a further 1 per cent would prefer moving to the nearest town and (or) state capital.

DEFINITIONS

REGISTRATION: The process of recording the details of displaced individuals into the system and assigning them to a checkpoint with the purpose of providing them with humanitarian assistance.

VERIFICATION: The process of validating the details of already registered individuals to ascertain if they still belong to a particular checkpoint.

CHECKPOINT: A location (camp or host community) where the registration of displaced individuals took place.
